1. It was quite coincidental that you should have forwarded the tape recording along with the reference. Recordings of the same poetry became available here on about the same day from another source. There are many additional poems by the poets listed in the reference in the recordings available here which are not contained in the tapes forwarded by you. One side of your tape contains a duplicate recording of some of the poems from the other side, but the tape omits other poems contained in the recordings received here. The question arises whether an error was made in the reproduction or whether the original received by was so recorded. 2. The name MANAJSUR is believed to be a pseudonym. There is no writer by that name known to individuals familiar with the Soviet Ukrainian literary field. Although the reference states that the tape forwarded contains poems by FNU KOSTENKO, such do not appear. The feminine voice heard on the tape may well be that of Lena KOSTENKO but she is reading poetry by SIMONENKO, now deceased. FYI: These poems by SIMONENKO were brought out by a Western traveller in manuscript form about a year ago but publication has been purposely delayed. It is expected that his poems now will be published in the near future. 3. It would be interesting to learn from Law ho exactly gave the poems to SUBOTIN, and whether he was told specifically that they were for publication in the West. We do not yet have all the specific details as to the manner of receipt by our source. The first

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exposed, the poets wanted their poetry analyzed and preserved in the West for a future time; (2) The recordings were given to SUBOTIN by a trusted colleague of the poets who is serving the KGB and was instructed to have them sent out for publication as a final provocation against the poets. The poetry contained in the tapes is not of a revolutionary nature but is very anti-regime from a nationalistic and socialistic standpoint; (3) Even if the poets did state that they wanted the poetry published in the West, it is felt that there is an obligation on the part of the recipients in the West to determine from a political standpoint whether their appearance in Western publications would be harmful to the poets concerned, and it is felt it definitely would be. Even if the poems were not attributed to the poets by name, their styles might reveal them as the authors.

- 4. It is requested that \(\) \(\) be urged not to publish the material in any case at least until the end of January, by which time we expect to have special information concerning the circumstances surrounding the Soviet Ukrainian writers and the poets concerned in particular.
- 5. SUBOTIN is being name checked. A separate dispatch will follow.

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
