1. Source met Subject on 24 Nov 1965 at the concert at the Palais des Sports in Paris. Source approached the Subject after he saw that the latter did not recognize him and so he had to remind Subject of his visit to "Shenoshist" in Leningrad in 1949. Subject at once remembered Source, remarked that he aged somewhat and then "all went smoothly". Subject was interested in what was going on in Paris, was he here alone or with other people, did he know anybody there, what was doing Yordank Solovov and others, did "Independent" mention Vladyka's performance in Paris etc. According to Subject he talked in Kiev with literary men, his friends about Kochelivets and they all were of a very high opinion about him as a literature-writer. Source, of course, Kochelivets and always his "name" was only because he had left Ukraine a long time ago and was not fully aware of all the forthcoming changes in the Ukraine. Subject stressed that since Pavel would like to talk to KOCHELIVETS as they were old acquaintances and surely will have much to talk about.

As to October-changes in the Kremlin Subject could not tell how things were developing because at that time he already was in France. "We are here for a long time with, we are interested..." "NASHI/CHIK came to USSR, to Berlin and told us of what had happened..." "By confidant... we had two operations - Vladyka's in Paris, and removal of Nikita in Moscow..."

From 20 Nov to 24 Nov 1964 Source saw Subject every day (until
Virsky's departure from Paris). Subject told Source his appraisal of the
Khrushchev situation as was reported on 21 Dec 1964.

In general Subject behaved in such a way as to indicate that his
sympathies were not completely with the regime and in this respect he might
take a step further, eventually. On Source's suggestion to defect Subject
replied: "Well, but how, I am married, I don't feel well ... " You want to turn
me over to nationalism completely."

He wanted to have an address but not that of Suchbatskaya in Leningrad
because "it was not suitable" and asked Source whether he would care
to Latin America where Virsky's Ensemble was supposed to perform in
the second half of February/early March. (N.B. According to Virsky (1964)
Virsky is scheduled to be in Latin America on 1-April 1964)

3. Subject knew about Hosenko's defection (which when there
was something wrong, he was sick or ...). In Leningrad,
Leningrad, Hosenko's father was Minister of Ship-Building, there are his
sister-in-law (Laydovna) in Leningrad in Lykolov...

4. According to Subject the arson in the National Library in Leningrad
was performed by a male employee who was a subaltern and had some contact
with the Director and another female employee. He was sentenced to 10
years imprisonment. Five years later, the secondary court
found the male employee guilty and sentenced him to 10 years
imprisonment. The male employee had not been of legal age at the time of the
arson.

5. According to Subject the rehabilitation process in the Soviet Union was
not finished and at the present there was talk about rehabilitation of

7. Subject claimed not to know any one really SHYKORALNYI. He said he had an introduction through to one "Confidant", aged 46-48, tall, brown hair, dark eyes, thin nose, 1913 birth name. Apparently he was born in 1913 but lived in Kiev. "The Confidant" was in company of a young woman, beauty, keen on jewelry and also refused to tell her name. Both told Subject he was no longer after "the introduction".

On 10 Nov 1944 Subject introduced Source to RUDENKO /9/ Assistant Director of Kiev office and Volodymyr (Mikhailov), representative of the Ministry of Culture.

Subject was also seen in company of a man, aged 45-50, according to Subject an ex-merchant from Kharkov whom he met incidentally and they had a nice talk. The merchant was usually in company of a young brown haired lady.
