SUBJECT

U. S. Piplomatic Relations with the UKSSR

- 1. In a conversation a source of this of ice had with Luka PALAMARCHUK,
  Minister of Foreign Affairs of the UkSSR and head of the Ukrainian Delegation
  to the U. N., on 10 January 1965, PALAMARCHUK told the source that when im
  Ambassador KOHLER visited him in Kiev he asked the latter how much importance
  should be propertied to the Fartstein/Smith resolution and whether the
  U. S. Department of State manifex was really in favor of establishing diplomatic
  relations with the UKSSR. KOHLER reportedly said that Washington was in favor
  of such relations and that if PALAMARCHUK would agree the United States would
  establish diplomatic relations "between Washington and Kiev". PALAMARCHUK
  told the source that he told KOHLER he would agree under two conditions; i.e.,
  that the United States recognize East Germany and that the United States agree
  to Soviet proposals on disarramment in Geneva. KOHLER's reply: Foreget about it.
- 2. The above information reportedly was told to the source by PALAMARCHUE during a discussion they had in the latter's office at the KNAKYX Soviet Mission in New York. PALAMARCHUE was expounding the Communist line that there is only one Soviet foreign policy and therefore no need for separate diplomatic relations with the republics; that he appraised establishment of diplomatic relations between Usraine and the West only from the point of view of how much this would serve the interests of foreign policy of the Soviet Usion in its purely interests nall aspect.
- 3. Should the above information have any dissemination value, the source may be described as a usually reliable source, a United States citizen, from a Western citizen of Ukrainlan birth, usually reliable source. No horeign Dissemination.
