

Mr. Lebed,

The following from John:

Constantine GENYK-BEREZOVSKY was one of Orest Z's best friends. He had about 5 brothers. Two of them were leaders of the Ukrainian Social Democratic party. Two were murdered by the Bolsheviks. At least two of them emigrated to the U. S. or Canada and used to correspond with Constantine when John was there. One committed suicide in Canada about 5-6 years ago. Constantine was imprisoned by the Germans in Buchenwald for several years. He was beaten in prison and had his nose broken. There were many Czechs in the prison with him, many of them Communists. John said he was very anti-Czech and considered them extremely materialistic. Studied medicine in Prague while living on a pension paid by Czech Government.

John does not know his wife. However, he said that Constantine did date a tall, attractive blond who was the daughter of Prague Professor Kornelyo ZAKLYNSKYI. According to John, the Professor was somewhat mentally disturbed. In Zakarpatya he led an anti-alcohol movement. John thinks Lesyak-Rudnytsky may know the daughter.

A Dmytro SICH has authored an article (or articles) in a Ukrainian students publication in the U. S. If he is the same Dmytro SICH from Zakarpatya who was in Prague, he will also know Constantine.

Another individual who may know Constantine is a Prof. Semen NARIZHNYI who was head of the Ukrainian museum and library in the Univ. of Prague. He reported is somewhere in the West.
