1. NOSOVSKYI A. (see Report on Soviet specialists in Gothenburg, Sweden dtd 10 Oct 1964) was contemplating to remain in the West and talked about it with Bhr. Finally, however, decided to return home because of wife and children. He was given by Bhr "Ukraina-Suchasne I Maybutnie" and two books by Koshelivets on contemporary Ukrainian literature ( all Proleg publications) .

The Soviet group staying at Goetenwerket left Gothenburg mid-Feb 1965 after works had been finished and since then Bhr stopped working as interpreter. He used however to see NOSOVSKYI afterwards in UDEWALA where works were continued on Soviet ships.

2. Two groups of Ukrainians are going to visit Ukraine in July 1965, leaving for Soviet Union on 4 and 12 July, respectively. Source has friends on both. In the group leaving on 12 July there is also a lady personally known to C.

SWIDERSKYI Alexander goes to Ukraine in Aug 1965 to see his son.
