Following a mailed invitation of the Mission to greate ato the party at their premisses on 24 Nov 196 at which the film Tini Zabutykh Predktv was to be shown, Dr Kl.EveP.LIS Olfa.MENGERS Natalia (wife of Prof MENGERS), and Father KRAYEVSKY Woledymyr (Order of Redemptorists of Newark, N.J.) arrived there at approx. 18.00 hrs. Prof MENGERS Joined on book or so later after having finished his lecture at Columbia. Father ERAYEVSKY was invited by Dr Kl to accompany them after he expressed the wish to go to the party .too.

At the party there were also SHUMETROS of Mew Ports, LYTYIN Myros (tweet of the Funeral Home) of Newark, N.J. Dr LEVITSKYI Wolfdymyr of Hew York, and the whole bunch of progressives headed by TOLOPKO.

There was also STASIUK Platos with his daughter and somein-law.

or Kl and her party were met by CHERNIAVEKY and KOCHUREY. The latter went at once after TRONKO who kept Dr Kl's company practically throughout the whole party. At the very beginning he told her that he had something special to discuss with her and asked her notice leave before that.

Whereas KOCHUBEY and CHERNIAVSKY were somewhat surprised by Father KRAIEVSKYI's arrival. TRONKO greated him with great reverence and then all the others followed his suit. Eve stayed mostly in company of SHEVCHENKOR who were very friendly to her. SHEVCHENKO gave his address in Kiev s

After the demostration of Tinia Zabutykh Predkiv (in color) they also showed Ukraine -Today , a sort of documentary for 10-15 minutes.

2. In a tete-a-tete with Dr Kl TRONKO told her the following:

a/ He has just returned from Canada. Where he discussed the same
problems they were laboring now on here in the States and in Kiev. Also there
he has heard about Dr Kl. He would like to assure her that despite her
political convictions, he and his colleagues in Kiev, trust her and believe
her attitude to the Ukrainian people was sincers. He would like to pay a visit

for Kiev on 27 Nov 1965 it did not matter because the main thing was he wanted to seep" Kl herself and the meeting with scholars and writers - her friends - was not so important at the present. (Dr Kl had indicated that she could organize a party on Thursday or Friday because she has already engaged by some other arrangements).

Moreover .TRONKO will come here again next year .probably quite soon, and on that occasion the meeting can be arranged.

b/ As soon as he arrives in Kiev .TRONKO will contact KOLOSSOVA, and together they will present the subject of Ukrainian Watholic Church and "language" (a suphemism generally used by people from the Mission and TRONKO for "Russification") to proper people. He can assure her that everything looked quite promising, and therefore Dr Kl and her friends will be able to visit Ukraine next year.

TRONKO stressed that KOLOSSOVA'S position was very strong "and we together with my other friends can do quite a lot".

To expedite the matter with the Church it is advisable that Cardinal Slipyi alone or even together with some other Ukrainian Cathalis Bishops abroad write a letter to Ukrainian Government in Kiev asking them to Tallow.

e/ According to TRONKO, they (in Kiev) need the help of emigration and DrkL would be very much appreciated for her efforts to convince her friends among scholars, students, and other professionals stop their attacks and shander against the Soviet Ukraine and putting obstacles to Kiev's work. He can assure Dr Kl that they (in Kiev) are doing all they can to improve the situation of Ukrainian people but there are many difficulties and not all can be done at once. "Let's help each other" - he continued. "We are being told that we should go together with Chinese but this is a complete nonsense. We cannot go with a war-party and we cannot expect anything positive from there. Instead, we - the people in the Ukraine and you here - the emigration, wer have to stick together and help surselves". By emigration, of course, as he explained, he meant in this pase "honest people".

3. On other occasion, in presence of Father KRAYEVSKWI, TROUKO mentioned again "as soon as I comedack to Kiew we shall discuss the church question". It was obvious that he wanted also Father KRAYEVSKYI to hear that.

- A. SHEVCHENKO measured both Dr K. and Eve that he will "definitely" see them next year in Kiev, preferably in July because as time time he will be vacationing in Elevisa too.
- 5. SHEVCHENKO was the one who accompanied PEDANIEK'S body to Kiew, He told Dr KI that PEDANIUK had been burried nearby MANUILSKEI'S grave.
- 6. CHERNIAVSKY told Dr Kl that in his epinion the Pere should sward to Dr Kl m special medal few what she is deing for the Cathelia Church. " If things will move as TRONKO is planning to now, Dr Kl will estain her goal".
- 7. CHERNIAVSKY has trouble with his son. He is getting dest and physicians have little hope that they could do something against it. EMEMIAVSKY is leaving for Kiev on 1 Dec 1965 and will return with his wife to New York around 25 Dec 1965. He is very much worked about his con-
- 8. GOLOVKO wanted some meterial on Uprainian emigre writers and Dr Kl promised to give him SLOVO # 1 and 2. When SHUMEIKO auggested that everybedy signs his name on her invitation GOLOVKO was quite frightened to put his signature and did so only on CHERMIAVSKYI'S strong himt. He told Dr Ki that heatlice wounded during the war.
- Q. MAKSIMENKO is staying in New York. BERKANS have just returned from Kiev. MRS BERKAN was very friendly to Dr Ki told her that early two weeks ago they had finally got the word that they would return to New York and were very happy about it.
- 10. TRUNKO was very friendly and polite, completely different than at the first execunter. He told Dr Kl that he had two daughters but eye died during the war.
- 11. SHEVCHENKO promised to lend Timis Zabutykh Prodkiv for making a copy (16 mm) for herself "and her friends". On this occasion he maked Dr Kl to make a copy also for himself what he would appreciate very much. He also hoped to get Son (The DREAM) and certainly would lend it to Dr Ki, too.
- 12. Mrs BRAZHNIK, fou of New York was discussing with SHEVCHENCO sending of parcels to Ukraine and complained that customs fees were too high. She asked SHEVCHENKO to help her in sending parcels to her relatives through the Mission and he promised to look into the matter.
