1. Early January 1966 Source received a gift from KOLOSSOVA Kateryna sent to him from Canada by Subject. The gift consisted of a wooden cigarette box and several Soviet books or rather pamphlets in Ukrainian. An accompanying letter from Subject dtd 5 Jan 1966 informed the Source that he (Subject) had recently visited the Ukraine and there met with KOLOSSOVA Kateryna. The latter asked him to convey the gift and mention that she had read Source's article on her group's visit to Canada and the States and liked very much Source's saying about her (Kolossova's) "singing Ukrainian language". Subject had also to convey Kolossova's greeting and asked Source to confirm the arrival of the gift.

2. On 24 Jan 1966 Source sent a letter to KOLOSSOVA directly, thanking her for the gift and suggested that she as the head of the Association for Cultural Contacts with Foreign Countries would continue to organize future visits of Ukrainian cultural workers to the States. At the same time he wrote a letter to the Subject thanking him for conveying the gift.

3. On 24 Mar 1966 Source ^{received} a letter from KOLOSSOVA with thanks for Source's letter and full page of phrasology about happy Soviet reality.

Prior to that Source received again several books and pamphlets sent by the Association for Cultural Contacts with Ukrainians Abroad and 3 Ukrainian records.

4. Source is planning to send KOLOSSOVA "History of Ukrainian Literature" by D. Chyzhevsky.
