or. Alien Roland (psychologist) and wife Jackie (PhD candid te in history), both of New York. They attended the psychological congress in Moscow, and before leaving NYC said that they might also visit Kiev. M gave them Korotych's name and the address and phone number of RANOK editorial office. Later M wrote K that friends from NYC might visit him on the 89th of August.

The Rolands returned to MYC Aug. 30, and immediately left for their country house in Mass. for 10 days. This memo is only based on the telephone conversation with Mrs. Roland.

whey arrived in Kiev on the 25th (there was a mix-up in dates) and found that K was out of town, in Irpinsk. They man god to contact him somehow, and he immediately returned to wiev on the 27th of aug. He had expected them on the 29th.

Mrs. Roland was very favorably impressed by K. She said he seemed the most easy-going person of all they met in the USSR.

(In Moscos they also contacted acquaintances of their other New York friends and those seemed more cautious than K)

K told them he had received a letter from R (sic!) telling him that the wolands were coming, and that he expected them on Monday. He was sorry that he could not take them to some of his artist-friends, as he had planned.

They spent half a day with K. He showed them part of the city and it seemed as if he wanted to be seen with them. In a rest ur not to mich he took them, everyone seemed to know K. The Rolands "had a wonderful time with K." Now they want to know more about Ukraine.

K told thom R should come to Kiev. Apparently very little or no reference was made to M.
