~~Mr. Zenkevichus came in to report that he had some new information for us on~~  
 Sikora who allegedly had been selected by the "Benderovski" Ukrainian nationalist organization to assassinate Dobrynin and Fedorenko. He said that the Soviet Embassy had received information from West Germany that Mr. Sikora is 40 to 45 years old and that he arrived recently in New York. He said that Sikora was involved in the death of Soviet General Vortutin in 1944 in the Ukraine. Mr. Zenkevichus added that Sikora was the name the individual in question had been using in West Germany, but he did not know what name the man would be using here. In response to a question, Mr. Zenkevichus said he still did not know Mr. Sikora's first name. Mr. Woods pointed out that without a first name it was very difficult for us to locate the individual. Mr. Zenkevichus said he understood. Mr. Woods then said that, as Mr. Zenkevichus was no doubt aware, we had provided extra police protection for Fedorenko, Dobrynin and Gromyko in New York.

Mr. Zenkevichus then produced another sticker type poster similar to those he had brought in previously. (See memcon dated September 21, 1966.) Like the previous stickers this one bore the notation "Liberation Enterprises; Apex Station; Box 6189; Washington, D.C. 20004." It read "Support National Independence for Republics in USSR." Mr. Zenkevichus said this sticker had been placed on the wall of the Soviet Consulate, 1609 Decatur St., N.W., yesterday, September 25, between 3:00 and 4:00 p.m. He said the placing of the sticker had not been observed.

Mr. Zenkevichus promised to give us any other information on Sikora which he might receive.

**Alleged Intentions of Ukrainian Nationalist Group to  
Make Attempt on Life of Dobrynin and Fedarenko**

At 3:45 p.m., on September 22, 1966 SA Releases called from USUN  
and advised the following:

On evening of September 21, 1966 Detective Eli Kerner, BOSSI Squad,  
New York Police Department spoke with Mr. Evagry N. Alechin, First Secretary  
Soviet Mission, New York City, concerning Subject. Mr. Alechin stated that  
he does not at this time know what protective coverage Ambassador Fedarenko  
might want but would have the information by 3:00 p.m., September 22, 1966,  
if a meeting could be arranged for that time.

On the morning of September 22, 1966 Mr. Alechin and Mr. Evagry N.  
Masinovski - Consulars, Soviet Mission, New York City, stopped at USUN to  
speak with several members of the legal staff. They stated their request  
for coverage of Dobrynin, Gromyko, Fedarenko and Soviet Mission in New York  
City. They then contacted BOSSI and confirmed their meeting, however, changing  
it from 3:00 p.m., to 4:00 p.m.

Secretary Bask made the statement to SA Releases that definite coverage  
of the three would be necessary in Washington, D. C., should any of them decide  
to travel here. The Secretary further stated that the solution for this  
problem does not lie in the protective coverage but the locating of Sikars.
