1. It was reported by AECASSOWARY/29 that contact was established with Subject, a Soviet exchange student, by student collaborators of the AECASSOWARIES in February of this year. Nothing much has developed to date, but A/29 was told that the Subject will be given an opportunity to meet other American students of Ukrainian background and that Ukrainian-language literature will be made available to him.

2. The following limited information about the Subject is all that has been reported to A/29 to date: The Subject was born about 1933. He is married and has two sons, aged 5 and 10. He comes from Luhansk and is an "engineer of automatization." The Subject lives at 1317 Walnut Street in Berkeley, California. The Subject reportedly visited Rome, Italy, in 1964 and has travelled in other areas of Western Europe. He is fond of skiing and says he holds the title of Soviet Ski Master. The Subject expects to be in Berkeley until June 1968.
