1. Following are the results of Headquarters traces on the KGB personalities mentioned in paragraph 7 of the reference:

a. Major FNU KOROTKY

A FNU KOROTKIY was employed as a clerk in the Soviet Embassy in Istanbul in 1948. No date or place of birth or other identifying information.

The name of a Lt. Col. FNU KOROTKIY appeared in a July 1948 list of lt. colonels in the MGB. No identifying information.

b. Lt. FNU VOVCHENKO

No identifiable information.

2. Headquarters will be interested in KOLASKY's book about his experiences in the Ukraine. Please forward a copy when and if it is published in Canada.

3. As was stated in earlier correspondence, KOLASKY is suspected in the West of having compromised certain Soviet Ukrainian intellectuals from whom he may have received documents before he was released from the Soviet Union. It is of course difficult to believe his story that he convinced Soviet officials that he received documents from "unknown individuals." It

4. As you know, the information KOLASKY may have to contribute about the Higher Party School tends to lose any usefulness it may have had as more time elapses. At your discretion you may wish to advise SMABOVE that it may not be worthwhile for WOFIRM to talk with KOLASKY about such matters unless this can be accomplished in the very near future.
