1. BRAYCHEVSKY, Mylhailo; KOTSIUBYNSKA, Mylhailyna; and MEKRAS OV, Viktor were fired from their jobs. SEVRUK Halyna is expected to be fired. FRANKO Zina withdrew her signature from the Protest of 239 under the pressure from her students who begred her to do so to have her at the Institute. She retained her lecturship at the University. Her son was admitted to the University.

All these expulsions are connected with the Protests and the letter against POLTORATSKY'S article in Literaturna Ukraina against Chornovil and his defenders.

2. The Protest of 230 was initiated by physycisks and mathematicians. None of them withdrew their signatures.

Also HONCHAR Oles, Lina KOSTENKO, NEKRAS: OV, KOTSIUBYNSKA, LUKASH, SEVRUK, DRAC HORSKA and other "dissidents" refused to do so.

KOZACHENKO and POLTORATSKY are in charge of present campaign against the "discidents". NIKITCHENKO, the KGB chief, seems to be not very happy about it and would rather prefer to have things "calmed down". KOZACHENKO was reported to have said that it would be necessary "the others should be dealt with as those in Madovia".

3. Around 12-13 Sept 1960 MOROZ Valentin was to be re-tried. Redently he was held all the time at Kiev Prison.

4. Beside Lina KOSTENKO and Ivan DZIUBA, also NEKRASSOV and Mykhailyna KOTSIVBYNSKA are expected to be expelled from the Union of Writers of Unraine. By now already three times the Presidium of the Union of Writers was trying to arrange for a decident at which the case of Lina ROSTENKO was to be decided and no one wanted to preside over her expulsion. ROZACHENKO (in other report HIKITCHENKO) sent KOCHUR Bryhori to Lina K stenko asking her not to go to the session at which her case would be decided in order to avoid further exacerbation of the situation.

KOCHUR was also asked to "negotiate" with DZIUBA and Other "discidents".

5. Five"Mordovians" incl. Bohdan Horyn have been released from the concentration camps, and prisons. Bostly those with terms up to 3 years like HEL and HEVRYCH. Also VIRUN was released and LUKIAHENKO brought back to Mordovia after he refused to disclose how Zakhalavný materials are being smuggled out of the camp.

6. People in Kiev and Lvov expect something to happen in the fall 1968 that will change their situation. This allegedly is not based just on their wishfull thinking but some "under surface indicators" learned from the top echelons of the party.

7. Soviet invasion in the CSSR was a gtrong setback for people in Kiev and Lvov. It dashed their hopes that similar developments as the CSSR-liberalization will get better chances to materialize. The attitude of SHELEST is explained as that of a man who was afraid he might have his post. Instrumental in Soviet move against CSSR was above all Red China. The Soviet Union would be then under pressure from both sides: communist West and communist East (China).

8. SWITLYCHNY and others were worried that because of latest events in CSSR the line of communication through CSSR will break down.

9. Instead of money people are now more interested in parcels. All kind of "orders" had been placed.

10. Ivan DRACH has been removed from his post as Secretary of the Union of Writers because of his refusal to withdraw his signature from the Protest. He RIso threatened with expulsion from the party.

(By the way, he is growing a beard.)

11. Irena JESHERMO warned again against Les' HERASYMCHUK. His true name is Oleksandr Abramovich NASUSHKIN. STESHENGO introduced him into U rainian milieu and he stole from here a bunch of materials from the archives of STESHENEO-KOSACH-GWARYTSKY.
