1. Meeting was arranged by Kulyk Andriy who telephoned Butiuk, Victor at the Ukrainian Mission to the U.N. and set the date for the meeting. Batiuk told Kulyk that he would bring with him somebody from the Mission, since source would also be present. It was decided to go to a Chinese restaurant on the 6th, and afterwards go to Kulyk's apartment for drings.

Source meet Batuik at 6:15 P.M. on the corner of Lexington Ave. and 67th St. and went together down the block to where an embassy automobile was parked. By the automobile were OVSIUK, Alexander, who was Batiuk's partner for the evening. Also present were SCHEVCHENKO, a member of the Mission and T.ACHENKO, a chauffer. All four individuals got into the car and drove to 3rd Ave. and 5th St. where Kulyk was waiting to be picked up. With Kulyk in the car, it proceeded to Chinatown, where Kulyk, Source, Batiuk and Ovcius got out and went to a restaurant for dinner. Schevehenko and Thachenko drove off.

- 2. OVGIUK. Alexander: Is in his middle 30's, has a slim build, sharp facial features. He smokes and enjoys drinking, when asked what his function is at the Mission, he replied that he is an attache and can be considered the public relations man at the Mission. He is married and has children, but did not specify how many. His wife and children are in New York with him.

 Ovgluk was born in bonbas, but lived in Cherkas'ka oblast for quite a while. He attended Moscow University and speciallized in Smanskrit. Ovcluk mentioned that he will go to Miev for a visit the 23rd of December. During conversation, Ovcluk gives the impression that he is well versed in Ukrainian emigre affairs and is particularly interested in student affairs. He is rather easy going and did not engage in open arguements with source.
- 3. On the question of why the Mission does not hold press confrences, or engage in public relations. Ovgick replied that they do in fact hold press conferences but the American press does not publicize them, and writes that everything is Russian. Source argued that it was their cuty to correct the news medic, and make the distinctio between "Russia" and the Ukrainian SSR.

Source asked if it was possible for Ovgiuk to obtain any recent review produces in Ukrame not of a propaganda nature. Ovgiuk mentioned that it would be best to write to the Association for cultural ties with Ukrainians abroad in Kiev and that they could possibly get such films. Overall went on to say that the film "Shadows of Forgotten Ancestors" was once given to are. Whichis and she made a copy of it. Source was than told that there were no files presently available in the Mission, but if any hap on d to be there, Overalk would let Source know about the possibilies of getting them.

- 4. On a discussion about ferment in Ukraine and the arrests of Ghrainian intellectuals, Ovçium gave answers which were rather symphatetic towards the arrested intellectuals. He conceded that the arrests were illegal and were bud policy. Batium on the other hand took an agresive stand towards Source and belitteled the arrests of Soviet Ukrainian intellectuals. Batium aid not like the tone of the discussion and wanted to leave as soon as possible. When Source mentioned the works which have been published in the West, and asked Ovcium if he had read any of them, Ovcium replied that he did read excerpts from Dzyuba in the U.S. Batium paid attention to this and added that he had read "Krym z Mohyly" and said that all the poems in it were written by Myhola Mholodny, although the editors did not publish this fact. Batium said that Kholodny had taken those same poems to be published in Kiev, but they were rejected by the editors.
- 5. Source asked Ovgiuk if he had any opinions on Shelest and other leaders in Niev. Ovgiuk said that he did not agreee with everything that Shelest did, but recorned him as a fine leader. Bathuk did not want this topic to continue and started kink talking about music.
- 6. Overalk asked Sommer about the Ukrainian student Congress which took place mask the 22 and 20rd of November. He wanted to know who was elected president of SUSTA and what the tone of the alsoussions were.
- 7. The party broke up at 11:30 P.M., once outside the building, Batiuk hailed the first available taxi and he and Ovgluk jumped in without saying goodbye to Kulyk and went home. There was no talk of a future meeting.
