Served in American Forces, WW II. Is rinishing his doctorate in history at Columbia University. Knows Ukrainian problem in its historic background and is acquainted with the modern liberation movement. He spent two years in Czechoslovakia studying the Ukrainian problem and its relation to central Europe.

Michael Dudra, 505 Highland Ave., Steubenville, Ohio. PhD in Economics. Now teaches economics in small college. Is thoroughly acquainted with Ukrainian Nationalist movement. Has many contacts and is able to evaluate individuals and situations.

Lev Bobriansky, Asst. Prof. Economics, George Washington University, Washington, D.C. Though one-sidedly informed about the Ukrainian movement and the problem of Ukrainian independence, is one of the more dynamic young men, with second-hand knowledge of Ukrainian liberation movement.

Walter Riznyk, 3316 206 St., Bayside Long Island, N.Y. A man with positive characteristics, who knows the Ukrainian National movement in the United States and abroad.
