- The agreement stipulating the conditions for the subsidization of the newspaper. SUCHASNA UKRAINA, was signed on 12 December 1950 as per MGM-A-4846.
- 2. On 12 December 1950, CASSOWARIES 3 and 4 concluded negotiations for a five-room office at Karlsplatz 8, in downtown Munich. The new office will house the headquarters staff of CASSOWARY 1 and its military mission as well as the newspaper staff. A member of the newspaper staff will live in the office so that Sthe premises will never be left unattended. CASSOWARY 1 will maintain one small room in the Dachauerstrasse office building as a pretext for its members to main--tain coverage of the multifarious allied activities which are carried on there by other emigre organizations.
- 3. On 11 December 1950, CASSOWARY 3 applied at the IRO headquarters in Warner Kaserne, Munich area, for permission to re-issue his former newspaper under a new name. The license to publish his former newspaper expired on 31 December 1949. CASSOWARY 8 was informed that Mr. Reyner, head of the political information office of IRO, would pass on his request by 15 December 1950. On 15 December, CASSOWARY 8 was informed that Reyner was no longer head of the pertinent desk and that Reyner's successor (name could not be determined) was ill and would not assume his duties until after the Christmas holidays. On 27 December CASSOWARY 8 was told that Mr. Reyner's successor would not arrive from Geneva until 3 January 1951. In coordination with the FJCAPE representative, who has been kept au courant of developments, it was decided to permit CASSOWARY 1 to print the first edition of the newspaper prior to the receipt of IRO sponsorship. High level liaison with IRO officials has already been initiated by FJCAPE to forestall any difficulties that might result from the publication of the newspaper before official sponsorship is obtained.

4. It was originally intended that the title page should bear the follow heading:

To forestall any possible objections on the part of IRO which sponsors only non-political publications, or protests to IRO on the part of the CAVATINA group, it has been decided to head the title page as follows:

SUCHASNA UKRAINA Organ Ukrainskoi Vizvolnoi Dumki

The third page of the paper will contain the statement of editorship as follows:

SUCHASNA UKRAINA
Dvotizhnevik
Vidaye ZP UHVR
Nachanii Redactor ---Vidpovidnii Redactor ----

If no complications arise as a result of the second plan, the publishers will in the near future revert to the originally contemplated title page if such seems feasible and desirable. CASSOWARY 3 is amxious to avoid any compromise of prestige in attempting the immediate implementation of the original titel page and in having IRO possibly rule that the statement of political connection and interest be eliminated.

5. Initially, the publications will appear bi-weekly in 5,000 copies. The paper will be distributed approximately as follows:

1,000 copies to English

1,500 copies to U.S. and Canada

1,000 copies in Germany 500 copies to Australia

1,000 copies to various other countries.

Except for the first issue which will comprise 16 pages, the paper will consist of 12 pages. The paper will have a tabloid format equivalent in size to the German newspaper "Echo der Woche". The printer is one Slusharchuk, Rosenheimerstrasse Munich.

6. The newspaper will be directed by Eugene WRECHIONA, Dari REBIL, and Ivan BUTKOWSKI (Col. TSEL) Editors will be WRECHIONA, Lev BBID, and Wolodymir STACHIV. WRECHIONA will be editor-in-chief; STACHIV will be responsible editor. A complete list of the newspaper staff will be forwarded to Washington when CASSOWARY 3 submits the first monthly finance account.

7. It is expected that the first issue of the paper will be published between 28 and 31 December. CASSOWARY 1 is anxious to have the first issue in circulation before the Ukrainian Christmas Holidays 6-9 January 1951. Certain psychological advantage will be gained by having the paper make its debut at this time since

readers will have the holiday period to peruse and discuss its appearance and editorial policies. Moreover, subtle allusions to the parallelism between the birth of Christ and the newpaper will not be overlooked.
