AENOBLE Instructor Orientation Course

- 1. The aim of this course is to orient the AENOBLE instructors in KUBARK methods of mounting agent operations into the USSR, and to acquaint them with our facilities for agent training. It is not intended to train the instructors themselves in any of the subjects covered in the course. The course presumes a knowledge of clandestine techniques on the part of the instructor-trainees, and also a certain amount of instructing experience.
- 2. The instructors will participate in the AENOBLE training cycle, and in one instance, in the planning and preparation of the missions. Consequently, our lack of knowledge about operational conditions within the USSR and our support limitations should not be glossed over, nor should false impressions be made as to our capabilities.
- 3. It is currently planned that 4 instructor-trainees will participate in this course, two of whom have taken part in previous AENOBLE cycles. Only one of these men speaks English.
- 4. The tentative starting date for this course is 1 July 1954. It should require approximately two weeks. _______ training officer for AENOBLE, will be present full-time to assist in the instruction and to interpret where necessary.
- 5. A part of the course, largely dealing with documentation and IB support facilities will be given in Germany prior to 1 July.

- 1. Airborne, Maritime, Balloon and Overland Border Crossing Techniques, and Training Facilities. Besides an explanation of the techniques themselves, some discussion of their applicability to various types of in and ex-filtration operations would be desirable. Cargo and personnel supply drops, selection of DZ's and landing beaches, use of guiding beacons and metascopes should be covered. There should be no discussion of areas available to KUBARK for dispatch purposes, except, perhaps, to say that they are limited. A demonstration, at least of an air dispatch whould be desirable,
- 2. Survival Training. Weapons, various specialized survival equipment, food and medical kits might also be covered under this heading.
- 3. W/T Communications. Equipment, Crypto, Security, D-F'ing, Blind Broadcasts, Sources of Power, Safety-Danger Signals, Commo Trg. /Problems, etc.

Security. The whole KUBARK approach to security of a training cycle should be covered in some detail. The security considerations pertaining to agent training in the U.S. should be covered, and the special restrictions which will govern the conduct of AENOBLE instructors and trainees while in the U. S. should be explained.
