<u>Action Reported by the Field:</u>								
<p>1. For the purpose of avoiding undue taxation of funds to be transferred to AEVIROIL 1 via a sterile funding mechanism, it was decided to submit an application for "gemeinschaft" status for AEVIROIL 7. AEVIROIL 6 was informed in late August that the application was being processed and that he was due to receive official notification in early September. In the meantime, he made plans to go to Munich to discuss the technical aspects of the funding mechanism with regard to handling of the funds and the bookkeeping required.</p>

Word was received that AEVIROIL 4, the present group leader, may find it necessary to resign his post and leave the organization in order to emigrate because of the condition of his wife's physical and mental health. Though the problem of finding a replacement for him would not be an easy one, AEVIROIL 4 has never been considered the ideal man for the job, and the occasion of his resignation may provide the opportunity to insert a better qualified man into the position.</p>								
<p>3. AEVIROIL 7 has reported that he has made great progress in his TBY to the United States to reorganize the American AEVIROIL 1 chapter. It is noteworthy that most of the people AEVIROIL 7 talked to about AEVIROIL 1 were either sympathetic to the organization or expressed a willingness and even a strong desire to participate in the work of the organization. For instance, one of the most intelligent emigres stated that for the first time he was impressed with the work of an emigre organization and that he was offering his services. Similar responses have been received from other outstanding writers and journalists. At a meeting of the chapter presidium an ambitious plan was formulated which involved ten activities. Though immediate implementation of the whole plan would be over-ambitious, six or seven of the activities can be immediately launched; several have already been begun.</p>								
<p>4. An AEVIROIL 1 public meeting on the subject of ZEMINVEST was held in Munich on 29 August. Although we do not yet have a detailed report, we have been informed that the meeting was an unqualified success; the hall was packed and many Germans approached the AEVIROILITES after the meeting to express their interest in the organization and in such meetings which emphasize subjects of common interest to the German population and AEVIROIL 1.</p>

5. The field eagerly awaits copies of the Russian edition of the Djilas book. On the basis of the material available in English the AEVIRGILITES have written a long leaflet and an article for the next issue of AEVIRGIL 70, the monthly magazine. A Russian-language brochure is also planned.

6. The distribution of the Dudintsev novel, Not By Bread Alone, continued during the month. Approximately 3100 copies have now been sold.

7. Issue No. 8 of AEVIRGIL 70 was issued early in August (2500 copies).

8. The AEVIRGIL 1 print shop turned out 2,216,000 DIN A7 units during August. It became clear during the month that the presses are in need of repair.

9. A total of 4,931,450 DIN A7 leaflet units were ballooned in sixteen actions in August by the AEVIRGIL 1 team.

10. AECACOTOL balloon operations (AEVIRGIL 1 ballooning from Berlin) was cut drastically in July (latest month reported on) due primarily to a lack of hydrogen. Only 3,268,518 DIN A7 leaflet units -- about twenty-five per cent of the team's usual output -- were dropped. Preparations were made for transferring the team from Berlin to West Germany temporarily until the Berlin hydrogen problem is solved.

11. Word was received that AEVIRGIL 107 and his wife received their Spanish visas in August and were preparing to leave for Madrid and service with the radio station there.
