Subject for KUBARK Treatment

ACTION REQUEST: For Field Consideration

1. KUBARK has been reviewing the files on Soviet documentation for possible leads suitable for KUBARK exploitation. The following has been offered for your consideration.

2. In view of recent Soviet propaganda emphasis on the Middle East situation, the following discriminatory elements and practices of the Soviet internal KUBARK system are noted:

A. Entry 3 of the standard internal KUBARK calls for the nationality (nationality) of the source. The source may be identified as a Russian or non-Russian by this entry. Persons of other than Russian nationality are identified as belonging to the ethnic group of their origin, in many instances ethnic minorities not considered to be strongly pro-Soviet and less reliable in the eyes of the regime. The repeated completion of this entry identifying the source as a member of Ukrainian or Polish origin rather than of Russian nationality can well be considered discriminatory. The Soviet citizen might ask the question, "If there is no discrimination, why is this entry necessary?"

Many Soviet defectors report strong anti-Semitism in the USSR. Jews are identified as such in Entry 3, regardless of their geographic origin within the USSR. Discrimination based on documentary identification as Jew is reported by recent defectors. In the words of one source, "Being Jewish is a hindrance to one's life and occupation," and attempts to keep one's Jewish origin hidden from the authorities have been reported by several sources. The identification of Jews by entries on their identity document is a reality in the scheme of document systems in the world. The most recent proposal of this practice was the East Berlin in Germany.
