<b>Action Reported by the Field:</b>						
1. It was decided to send ANVINGIL-5 to Belgium for discussions with the local ANVINGIL-1 Chapter regarding ANVINGIL-1 activities during the Brussels Fair.						
2. Information from Moscow by Leonid Radomov was printed by ANVINGIL-1 during December. The publisher's work for Leonid along continued to do quite well. A total of 4,000 copies have been sold or are in the hands of distributors.						
3. At Headquarters' suggestion, ANVINGIL-1 made formal application with the New York publisher Fraenger for the Russian language rights to Howard Fast's recent book <u>The Naked Sun</u> . A positive reply is expected shortly from Fraenger.						
4. ANVINGIL-1's visit to Radio Rome and his discussions there with officials of the radio were an unqualified success. He was accorded a warm reception, which bodes well for the future of ANVINGIL-1 with Radio Rome. He reported that the station seemed to be desperate for Russian language material and would welcome ANVINGIL-1 contributions, which would be broadcast with full attribution to the organization. ANVINGIL-1 is making a determined effort to attract competent and experienced writers in order to improve the quality of their radio scripts.						
5. ANVINGIL-1 was forced to disqualify its prime candidate for replacement of ANVINGIL-3 in Berlin. It was learned that the man in question has a brother in the Soviet Union whose return he is trying to arrange.						
6. It was learned that although IS 776 intends to accept the employment offer of Radio Liberation, he plans to join ANVINGIL-1 as an active member and contribute in his spare time.						
7. Due to the virtual unavailability of hydrogen in West Germany for purposes of political ballooning, the ANVINGIL-1 balloon team dropped only 394,300 Din-4-7 units in three actions during December. However, tentative arrangements have been made to procure hydrogen from Austria.						
8. For the first time since its inception, the ANACOTOL balloon team (now based in West Germany, although originally in West Berlin) failed to launch a single balloon in November, which is the latest reporting period available. Hydrogen was completely unavailable to this team.

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9. 3,000 copies of Issue #12 (66) of "SVOBODA" were distributed early in December and Issue #1 (67) came off the press at the end of the month.

10. 3,500 copies of Issue #14 of "DER ANTI-KOMMUNIST" were distributed in mid-December.

11. Due to the lack of ballooning capability during the month, only one Russian language leaflet was printed, in the amount of 1,430,000 Din-A-7 units.

12. On the evenings of 24 and 25 December unsuccessful attempts were made to break into the AEVIRGIL-1 office through the cellar. Both times the intruders escaped when the police arrived. No further details are available.

13. During the evening of 7 November the small warehouse used by the AECACOTOL balloon team in Schoeningen was broken into. The circumstances were such that the action was unquestionably of MFS inspiration. A number of balloons belonging to CAPROBOSCIS, which occupied another room in the same building, were pierced and ruined. However, the participants in the break-in were unable to get past the lock protecting the AECACOTOL material. They contented themselves with kicking in a small panel and reaching through the door to remove four pressure regulators worth about 0 DMW. After the previous month's occurrences, it had already been planned to move to another location. This appeared to be the opportune occasion, and the group was accordingly transferred to Helstedt.
