"CSI-F 10-5 prescribes procedures for operational approval, covert security approval, proprietary approval and related matters. As provided for in Section 9 (a), CSI-F 10-5, the use of individuals in unwitting, non-sensitive capacities on a part-time basis vithout proprietary approval is hereby authorized following approval of the Office of Security of requests for univer of approval requirements on an individual basis. Employees, members and individuals prominently identified with Project AEVIRGIL will require appropriate approvals in accordance with CSI-F 10-5."

- 3. It is understood that all employees, active members, and persons prominently identified with AEVIRGIL shall require appropriate approvals in accordance with CSI-F 10-5.
- 4. With regard to "part-time" contributors to ARVINGIL, it is requested that this office be provided their names, as such biographic data as is possible to obtain, and a general description of their duties or relationship with ARVINGIL.

I. Terms of the Flan

1. The provisions of this Administrative Flor are designed to cover the subsidy paperts of Project ANVINGIL. Nationally payments (e.g. project salaries and other expenses paid directly by the case officer(s)) will be accounted for under entities KUBARK regulations.

H. Budget

- 2. On or before I famory of such year, the field these officer shall obtain from the foreign principal agent(s) an annual budget for the casuing KUBARE fiscal year, containing at least the fellowing information for both field and stateside activities:
 - (a) Assicipated income by principal source; and
 - (b) Expenditures by principal expense categories.

This budget will be reviewed by the field case efficer and the Chief of Station and then forwarded with recommendations to SR Division where it will serve as a basis for properties the annual project operating budget.

J. Prior to presentation of the project to the approving suther the budgetary responsibilities of the Office of the Comptroller shall be discharged by his designed on the Staff of the SSA-DD/S. The concurrence of the SSA-DD/S shall indicate completion of an affirmative review. In the event of nonconcurrence, the project will be returned through the FP Body to the operating division for appropriate action.

III. Funding

4. Within the smount of the project allotment and based upor an approved request for an advance, fends will be made available either to (a) the field case officer for transmittal to an efficial of the Organization or (b) Finance Division will transmit funds directly through occure busing the channels to the Organization, entonsibly as greate from a stateside

donor selected by SR Division and the Central Cover Branch. Accountability for funds advanced by Finance Division will be transferred to the Chief of Station.

5. In addition, within the amount of the approved project allotment, funds may be passed for the project activities in any other manner agreed upon by SR Division, Central Cover Branch, and the Office of the Comptroller.

IV. Financial Reporting

- 6. When funds are transmitted by the field case officer, a receipt will be obtained from the Organization or the official accepting the funds for the Organization showing the date and amount of funds received and acknowledging the general purpose(s) for which such funds are provided. These receipts shall be transmitted promptly to the Authorized Field Certifying Officer.
- 7. When funds are transmitted by the Finance Division through banking channels to the Organization, a suitable letter will be sent by the ostensible donor informing the Organization of the grant and requesting acknowledgment of it. The Organization's letter of acknowledgment, the original of which shall be sent to the ostensible donor for his retention and a signed copy given to the field case officer, shall state the date and amount of funds received and the general purpose(s) for which they were given. The field case officer shall retain the signed copy and transmit a sterilized version of same to the Authorized Field Certifying Officer.
- 8. At least quarterly the foreign principal agent shall submit a signed financial report on both the field and stateside activities of the Organization to the field case officer, containing the following information for the reporting period;
 - (a) Total funds received from KUBARK;
 - (b) All other income received, by source;
 - (c) Total expenditures by general purpose; and
 - (d) Total cash on hand at the beginning and end of the period.

The stateside group will transmit its quarterly report to the field installation of the Organization so that it can be consolidated into the over-all report.

9. The field case officer shall review the financial reports and attach his certification thereto, attesting that, to the best of his knowledge and belief, the reports accurately reflect the disposition of the KUBARK funds advanced and that such funds were expended for the purposes authorised by the project approval. The certified reports will be approved by the Field Approving Officer and forwarded to the Field Finance Representative.

V. Writeoff - Funds

- 10. The Authorized Field Certifying Officer is empowered to accept the receipts and/or the sterilized copies of the letters of acknowledgment referred to in paragraphs 6 and 7, above, as the basis for writeoff to cost of the amounts involved and for recording in the memorandum accounts.
- 11. The Field Finance Representative is empowered to accept the financial reports, when certified and approved, for writeoff from the memorandum accounts.

VI. Supplies and Equipment

- 12. Nonexpendable KUBARK property issued to the Organization will be dropped from accountable records at time of issue. If property thus dropped is ever recevered by KUBARK, it will be picked up on station or Headquarters, as appropriate, accountable records at the time of recovery.
- 13. Notwithstanding the fact that accountable records for property thus issued will not be required of the station or Headquarters accountable officer, the case officer responsible for the project will see that appropriate informal property records are maintained to ensure common-sense control of property utilization and to provide maximum protection for KUBARK's investment under the operational and security considerations attendant to this project.

VII. Security and Personnel Policy

- 14. In the utilization of individuals under this project, any exceptions to CSI 10-5 and FR 10-215 shall require the prior approval of the Office of Security or CI Staff, as appropriate.
- 15. Commitments to nonstaff persons which are made as ODYOKE commitments will be documented in writing either by contract or by Memorandum of Oral Understanding in accordance with CSI 20-4 and FR 30-5, or any supersoding KUBARK issuances.

VIII. Notification to the Field

16. SR Division is responsible for providing the appropriate field officials with a copy of this Administrative Plan.



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III. OBJECTIVE AND PROJECT PROPOSAL:

1. The objective of Project AEVIRGIL is to conserve, develop and utilize for the political and psychological struggle against the USSR the human resources constituted by the emigration of that nation. To this end, the Central Union of Post-War (now Political) Emigres (TsOPE), whose headquarters are in Munich, was organized and is being supported and controlled by CIA for exploitation as: a) a controlled organizational framework for Soviet emigres; b) a device for encouragement

to potential Soviet defectors; c) a vehicle enlisting the talents of recent defectors in the anti-Soviet struggle and as a means for assessment, orientation and training for this purpose; d) an attributable source and working mechanism for the conduct of active PW operations against the USSR and its nationals and official representatives abroad.

2. It is proposed that financial support of ANVIRGIL be continued to enable it to continue and expand its broad program of PP activities, which include: leaflet distribution operations via its two balloon teams; editorial production of propaganda literature (leaflets, pamphlets, brochures, cartoons, etc.); propaganda school; printing shop, which prints the AEVIRGIL propaganda output and certain selected books deemed to be of particular use to ABVIRGIL 1 or/and the general anti-Communist world, and which might otherwise not be printed; publication of overt press organs: the Russian language monthly journal, "Svoboda," and the German language journal, "Der Anti-Kommunist;" other activities include periodic press conferences utilizing new defectors and/or capitalizing on major developments in the Soviet Union; mass meetings for German public as well as Soviet emigres on topics which are appropriate for propaganda exploitation; regular and systematic seminars for German youth and political groups. TsOPE also sponsors a weekly radio program over the Munich radio facilities of VOA. It has concrete plans to provide scripts and personnel to Radio Madrid. It also maintains close liaison with USEP and with those American and German voluntary agencies in the welfare field in Germany to assist in and obtain rehabilitation aid for Soviet emigres in West Germany. TsOPE supplies secure and effective cover for the FI Project AECARRERA in Berlin which enables BOB to exploit those REDCAP operational opportunities arising from the propaganda distribution operations of AEVIRGIL.

IV. STATEMENT OF ACCOMPLISHMENT DURING THE PAST YEAR AND ESTIMATE OF EFFECTIVE-NESS:

l. The CTA investment in TsOPE during the past several years has begun to show substantial dividends. TsOPE has been developed into one of SR Division's primary PP mechanisms. During FY 1957 there were approximately forty-five tons of TsOPE literature dropped over East Germany by balloon. By way of comparison the figure for FY 1956 was approximately twelve tons. During the Hungarian and Polish crises in particular, TsOPE was used to pipe-in news and interpretation thereon to the Soviet forces in East Germany on a mass basis. Though there were no defections to TsOPE during this period, earlier in the fiscal year a Soviet civilian used TsOPE facilities in Berlin to establish contact in the West. In addition to its leaflets and brochures for ballooning, TsOPE continued to publish its two more substantial publications, "Svoboda," distributed on a monthly basis and "Der Anti-Kommunist," a bi-monthly publication. TsOPE completed its

first book printing job in FY 1957 in the amount of 6000 copies of Dudintsev's controversial book Not By Bread Alone. TsOPE achieved a significant organizational goal when our efforts to broaden the membership basis of the group were met with success. The TsOPE label, which had become well known and which had accrued a certain amount of good will and prestige, was preserved in that the new TsOPE was simply renamed the "Central Union of Political Emigrants from the USSR," substituting the word "political" for "post-war" in the title. Since the broadening of TsOPE was formally announced, about forty-five new members have been taken into the group. The reorganized TSOPE has allowed for significant steps forward and increased activity on all fronts. TsOPE has expanded its radio broadcast ties and these ties now include VOA in Munich, Radio Nacionale in Madrid and BCC in Formosa. TsOPE has also achieved a high level of activity in the political-propaganda field. It is currently conducting a series of political forum meetings which are attended by many well-known emigres. These forums develop good literary materials for TsOPE's German and Russian journals. They also attract Germans who are interested in Soviet affairs. It is significant to note that TsOPE has become the target of intensified RIS action. The individual leaders of the group have received threatening letters and have been vociferously denounced on the pages of the Soviet and East German press and in leaflets being circulated among the emigration. A tragic episode, but one which also points up the effectiveness of TsOPE was the kidnapping of AECADILT-1, a PA interviewer of East German visitors to the Berlin office of TsOPE.

2. The TsOPE propaganda framework has proved to be an effective and responsive mechanism to implement appropriate PP guidances. TsOPE's unique attribute in this connection is its amenability to control and direction of CIA staff elements. TsOPE has carried a large portion of our PP counter-action against the Soviet Committee for the Return to the Homeland. The Committee's caluminous attacks upon TsOPE in the pages of its newspaper attests to the effectiveness of the organization.

V. BRIEF STATEMENT OF PLANS FOR ENSUING YEAR:

Planning for the next fiscal year envisages an extension and continuation of TsOPE activities much as they have been described above, but on a larger scale in view of the human resources made available by the recent broadening action. The German sector must continue to receive ever increasing attention, since TsOPE's existence in Germany and its maintenance of headquarters there are becoming ever more dependent on the good will and support of the West German government. With its new resources TsOPE hopes to play a larger role in other areas of the world. Particular reference is made to the radio stations existing in such places as Madrid. It is also planned that more time and attention will be devoted to contact

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operations mounted against Soviet travelling representatives in the West. Going back again to the benefits of a broadened TsOPE, it is hoped that the relaxed rules for TsOPE membership will bring into the group certain political theoreticians of the wartime and pre-war variety who have the intellectual depth sufficient to help develop a more sophisticated political philosophy than it now possesses. Such a philosophy would give TsOPE increased stature both with Soviets with deviationist or defectionist bent and with Western governmental authorities, West Germany in particular, where political philosophy is popular. It will be the intent during FY 1958 to develop TsOPE to the point where it no longer has to be spoon fed, but can stand upon its own feet. It is not the intention to develop the group to a point where it is no longer controllable, but it is axiomatic that in order to set TsOPE on its feet, certain elements of fine control will have to be relinquished.
