SUBJECT : African-American Institute (AAI)

1. This memorandum requests approval of action proposed in paragraph 6.

- 2. As you know, over the past weeks an interdepartmental group has been negotiating a plan for
 refinancing the African-American Institute (AAI) by
 a combination of overt contracts with government
 agencies and grants from private foundations. This
 weald make it possible for CIA to withdraw in line
 with general agreements reached after several
 meetings involving the DCI, the Secretary of State,
 Mr. McGeorge Bundy, representatives of the Ford
 Foundation, the AAI and C/CA.
- It now appears that there will be enough overt government contracts and reasonable assurances of grants from the Ford and Rockefeller Foundations for AAI to move ahead. As indicated earlier, the basis on which Ford and Bockefeller would consider grants to the AAI would be that CIA no longer participate in its funding. We would, therefore, propose that CIA transmit to the AAI by 1 November the balance of its 1963 budget for AAI This would be done with (b)(1)the understanding that CLA would have no further responsit-(b)(3) bility for the AAI - financial or otherwise - after that date. This was the substance of the memorandum transmitted to the Department of State on 4 September, which was discussed on 5 September with Assistant Secretary Lucius Battle and his Deputy, Alfred Boerner.
- 4. This was discussed with the Chairman of the Board of AAI, Mr. Harold Hochschild, and with the President of AAI, Mr. Waldemar Nielsen, in Mr. Hochschild's office om 11 September by the undermigned and C/CA/3. This was agreeable to both Mr. Hochschild and Mr. Nielsen.
