DISCUSSION OF 11 JUNE 1957 BETWEEN REPRESENTATIVES OF
G-2 AND SDU CONCERNING ERNST ALBERT

On 11 June 1957, representatives of SDU and G-2 discussed in
connection with the Ernst ALBERT case. SDU pointed out the security
implications of the case as they affect the EMD and requested that
SDU furnish all information available to G-2 concerning
ALBERT.

In consideration of this request, it was agreed that G-2 would check their
files concerning SDU with all reports given by ALBERT to Heimrich
SCHMITT and the extent of their relationship; a statement concerning
the extent of SCHMITT's knowledge of ALBERT and ALBERT's activities
for the SDU; a list of names of EMD personnel known to ALBERT
and passed by him to SCHMITT.

It is SDU's position (in which the G-2 representatives
concurred) that the security of the EMD is of major importance
to American interests in Germany. SDU therefore, takes such steps
as it is able to insure the security of the EMD against hostile
penetration. In this respect, it is SDU's position that with the
information mentioned in paragraph 2 above, a more accurate
assessment can be made of the possibility that penetrations of
the EMD exist that might be traceable to ALBERT's activities.
