1. We attach hereto a <u>Nachrichtenstelle</u> , Hildesheim report concerning <p style="margin-left: 40px;">Ignatz APYRUBIS, alias V. WILPPMANN  Born 4 September 1899 in Mitau, Latvia  Residing, Hildesheim. Binumerstr. 86.</p> <p>We received this report from the BfV in response to our query based on FROB 5485,  7 October 1959. You will note that APYRUBIS is alleged to be active on behalf  of the RIS and that he had recruited the</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">Wanda *PETER  Born 11 March 1925 in Kermoschine, Estonia  Residing Oker. Vienenburgerstr 2,</p> <p>to serve as a live letter drop.</p> <p>2. The above information came to the attention of the <u>Nachrichtenstelle</u>  when they received an anonymous letter on 13 May 1959, which alleged that  LIPPMANN was an agent of the RIS. This letter had a return address of</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">*A B K  Feidolberg. Hausstr. 14.</p> <p>From the attached report it appears that the <u>Nachrichtenstelle</u> turned the matter  over to the Criminal Police. The Criminal Police were not able to determine who  had mailed the letter but, they did receive a report that APYRUBIS is employed by  a Western Intelligence Service. They also contacted PETER who admitted that  APYRUBIS had recruited her to serve as a live letter drop for his mail from  Latvia.</p> <p>3. On the basis of the report from the <u>Nachrichtenstelle</u>, the BfV  initiated traces with the British, French and <u>CIC</u>. The local <u>CIC</u> officer, of  course, passed the trace request along to us at the same time he traced the 66th  <u>CIC</u>. Our trace request to the BfV crossed the BfV's request to <u>CIC</u> and in  replying to our request, the BfV made no reference to the trace which they had  sent to <u>CIC</u>. Our request to the BfV, of course, specified "operational interest"  and we assume that two trace requests (ours and the BfV's) will eventually be  collated in the BfV machinery.</p>
