EMPLOYMENT:

At Cicero, Illinois

On 19 December 1960, Mr. Joseph SECHUBSKAS, Part-Owner of the Master Builders, a general contracting company, was contacted at 1815 South 19th Avenue. He advised that SUBJECT has been satisfactorily employed as a carpenter for the Master Builders since approximately 1953 and is currently so employed. Informant, stated, however, that on several different occasions, SUBJECT had been employed by the Security Construction Company because Master Builders was over-staffed.

At Chicago, Illinois

On 19 December 1960, Mr. Joseph FRIEDMAN, Security Construction Company, 1950 West Lawrence, advised upon inquiry that he had no employment records available concerning SUBJECT, but recalled that has been employed by this company on several different occasions as a carpenter during the 1950's. FRIEDMAN stated that SUBJECT was satisfactorily employed and would be eligible for rehire Informant said he was of the opinion that SUBJECT was employed at the Security Construction Company for a relatively short period of time in 1952 or 1953, and again for a short period of time in 1957 or 1958.

REF ERBNCES

At Chicago, Illinois

On 19 December 1960, Mr. Joseph FRIEDMAN, a developed informant, approximately 45 years of age, previously identified under the "Employment" section of this report, was friendly, cooperative, and gave every indication of being a stable, reliable individual when interviewed concerning SUBJECT.

At Cicero, Illinois

On 19 December 1960, Mr. Joseph SKORUBSKAS, a developed informant, approximately 5h years of age, previously identified under the "Employment" section of this report, was interviewed concerning SUBJECT. SKORUBSKAS was friendly, cooperative and gave every indication of being a stable, reliable individual.

Informant stated he has known SUBJECT for a period of approximately 5 years and knows nothing adverse concerning him. SUBJECT, who is married, the father of three children, has resided at 2113 South 49th Court in Cicero for over 5 years. He previously resided at 1938 South 48th Court. SKOHUBSKAS said SUBJECT does not belong to any questionable organizations and has no questionable associates, to his knowledge. He is definitely an individual who is anti-Russian and anti-Communist.

SUBJECT and his wife were both born in Lithuania and informant is of the opinion that they are not American citizens. However, informant stated that he is quite certain both are pro-American in their views. SUBJECT'S spouse's grandmother, about 85 years of age and also from Lithuania, has resided with the SUBJECT and his wife for a number of years.

On 21 December 1960, Mrs. Charles BROZAS, a developed informant, approximately 50 years of age, was interviewed at 2103 South 48th Court concerning SUBJECT. BROZAS was friendly, cooperative, and gave every indication of being a stable, reliable individual.

SUBJECT'S spouse's grandmother, who was born in Lithmania and speaks no English, has resided with SUBJECT and his wife for a number of years. SUBJECT is hard working, a carpenter by trade, and leads a normal, happy family life. He has no known weaknesses, belongs to no questionable organizations, has no questionable associates, according to informant, and is a reputable, reliable person. Informant said she is of the opinion that SUBJECT is pro-American in his views. She knows of no possible communist affiliations or connections SUBJECT might have.

EROZAS went on to state she knows very little concerning the SUBJECT'S background but believes he was born in Lithuania, as was his wife. Informant volunteered information that SUBJECT'S wife speaks broken English and has lived in the United States for a period of less than 10 years. SUBJECT, to informant's knowledge, enjoys good health, has never been in any type of trouble, and informant concluded by saying she knows nothing of an adverse nature concerning

NEIGHBORHOOD:

At Cicero, Illinois

On 19 December 1960, 2113 South 49th Court was observed to be a two story, stude home in a residential type neighborhood. On the same day, 1938 South 48th Court was observed to be a two story, brick spartment building in a residential-type neighborhood.

On 11 December 1960, Mrs. William SMITH, 2109 South 19th Court, was interviewed as a neighborhood reference. SMITH said SUBJECT, his wife, three children, and spouse's grandmother have resided at 2113 South 19th Court for a period of over 5 years and are well regarded in the neighborhood. SMITH knows nothing of an adverse nature concerning SUBJECT or his family and would be happy to recommend him as a reputable, reliable individual.

This informant is of the opinion that SUBJECT has no sommunist affiliations and she believes him to be pro-American in his views. Informant was unable to furnish any background information concerning SUBJECT. Spouse's grandmother is believed to have a son who resides in Germany and recently, within the past two years, visited SUBJECT'S family and other relatives in this country.

On 21 December 1960, Mr. Joseph TUMENAS was interviewed as a neighborhood reference at 1938 South 18th Court. Mr. TUMENAS, who spoke English with a foreign accent, advised that SUBJECT, his wife, and the wife's grandmother have resided at 2113 South 19th Court for more than 5 years. They are well regarded in the neighborhood.

TUMERAS stated that prior to this, SUBJECT resided at 1938 South 18th Court for a period of approximately two or three years and were well liked in that area. Informant advised that the above two addresses are within one block of each other. He went on to say that SUBJECT is a reputable, reliable individual of excellent character, who is pro-American in his views. This informant knows of no possible communist affiliations SUBJECT might have and knew nothing adverse concerning the

On 20 December 1960, the records of the Bureau of Vital Statistics,

130 North Wells, were reviewed and the following information was contained in these records:

Marriage License Number. 2313149, issued on 15 May 1954 to Vincas -----, age 33, and Miss Regina APIRUBITE, age 21. Information on this license reflected the above two individuals were married on 30 May 1954 by Reverend A. STASIS, Assistant at Holy Cross, 4557 South Wood, Chicago, Illinois.

An affidavit for a marriage license, number 2313149, dated 15 May 1954, contained the following information:

Vincas -----, a resident of Cicero, Illinois, was born 15 January 1921 and had never been previously married. Regina APYRUBYTE, born 4 September 1932, had never been previously married. They listed their address as 1938 South 48th Court, in Cicero, Illinois.

On 20 December 1960, Birth Certificate Number 691986 reflected that Arviydes Vincentas ______, a male son, was born 9 October 1956 to Vincentas ______, 35 years of age. The father was born in Zarasai, Lithuania and was a carpenter by trade. Bis spopse was born at Klaipeda, Lithuania, 24 years of age, and was shown to be Regina APIRUBIS.

The above mentioned child was born at Loretta Hospital in Chicago, Illinois. The parents resided at 2113 South 49th Court, Cicero, Illinois. The birth certificate reflected the parents have one other child.

On 19 December 1960, Jennie BEATTO, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Main Post Office, Canal Street, searched her records and advised that the only information she had concerning SUBJECT was that his Immigration and Naturalization File is numbered A-7 218 697. He resides at 2113 South 49th Court, Cicero, Illinois. This information, according to BEATTO, was obtained from an alien registration card dated 1960. The informant is of the opinion that SUBJECT'S Immigration and Naturalization file is not located in Chicago and that it could be located by checking the Central Office, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Washington, D.C.

On 16 December 1960, the index cards which reflect individuals naturalized in Chicago and surrounding areas were reviewed at the U.S. District Court Office, Old Post Office, in the names of SUBJECT with negative results.
