MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: ARTICHOKE

1. On 22 September, Mr. ██████████, DAD/OS, called to say that ██████████ and ██████████ are prepared to come over and process ARTICHOKE files at our convenience. After checking with Dr. ██████████ it was agreed that ██████████ and ██████████ should come over on the morning of Wednesday, 24 September, and that Dr. ██████████ shall assist them. Mr. ██████████ says that ██████████ will watch out for any material that might be of any interest to CTS and will make it available to them.

2. On the subject of Dr. ██████████ thinks that the consensus is that he has nothing to contribute in the line of research. I asked him whether Dr. ██████████ might not have been exploring this further on the occasion of his 19 September visit and, although Mr. ██████████ does not believe this to be the case, he will check with CTS.

3. I advised Mr. ██████████ of the full details of my conversation with Col. ██████████ and of my desire to assist him to the extent of outlining our position on ██████████. ██████████ agreed that I could tell him that we are inclined to go easy on him from a security standpoint, because of his propensity to talk, and that I could assure Col. ██████████ that any project involving ██████████ would be coordinated with him. In accordance with the new procedures for handling ARTICHOKE, CTS will be obligated to check with OS and OS would automatically check with ██████████ in view of the fact that ██████████ is a consultant of, and of primary interest to the Surgeon General.

4. On 23 September, Col. ██████████ called to say that he had talked to Col. ██████████ of the Surgeon General's Office and that ██████████ had advised him that he thinks very highly of ██████████ and that it will be essential to keep him cut into the picture. I advised ██████████ of my conversation with Mr. ██████████ and of the procedure outlined by him. Col. ██████████ is very pleased with this arrangement and considers that this coordination will give him maximum CIA support.
