The Ruben Sanchez documents, copies of which were sent to addressees in Reference C, contain no really important, or startling information. However, they do provide details on several points which are of definite interest:</p> <p>A. The FRA and the Bolivian exile community in general: The documents illustrate the varied nature of the exile community and the difficulty in getting the leaders of the various groups to work together.</p> <p>B. Chilean influence: On page 12 of Attachment 6 he reports on a meeting with liaison contacts (enlaces) of President Allende. "Coco" Paredes, the only "enlace" named in the paragraph may be Eduardo "Coco" Paredes, personal physician of President Allende, and as of March 1972 Director General of "Investigaciones."</p> <p>C. The Cuban hand: This corroborates Cuban training given FRA members. D. Modus operandus:

(1) Borrowing of passports seems fairly common; in addition to Sanchez himself, Cecilio Alarcon Quispe apparently used the Chilean carnet of Fernando Zapata Vargas (page 14, att. 6), while on page 25 there is an item headed "POR passports." On page 31 there is another reference, possibly to the same POR passports: "the passports won't be returned; they have been used. Possible to help them by renewing their documents and obtaining safe conducts."

(2) According to what Sanchez told the Peruvians, he intended to contact Pedro Garcia in Desaguadero and his trip was to test this route as a means of introducing anti-GOB propaganda into Bolivia. Sanchez was carrying with him US \$50 with which he intended to hire a car for the Tacna - Desaguadero - Tacna trip.

2. A recurrent topic is the split in the FRA, partly over whether there should be a sole military commander - Sanchez - who would be superior to the political leaders. The other side of this disagreement is described, albeit in typical Marxist language, in the FRA declaration submitted recently by [] (HCSA-17989, 24 October 1972).

3. Page 3 of Attachment 2 of Reference A, gives a list of the abbreviations of organizations appearing in Sanchez' notebook. Some of these are quite familiar to addressees while others may not be.

FRA -Frente Revolucionario Anti-Imperialista
(Anti-Imperialist Revolutionary Front).

PORM -Partido Obrero Revolucionario de Masas -
The "Masas" faction, led by Guillermo Lora Escobar, of the
Revolutionary Workers Party (POR - Trotskyist).

PORG -The faction of the POR led by Hugo Gonzales
Moscoso, known as the "Lucha Obrera" faction.

PCML -Partido Comunista Marxista - Leninista - the
pro-Chinese Communist Party of Bolivia(PCB/C).

PRIN -Partido Revolucionario de Izquierda Nacional
(Juan Lechin Oquendo's party).

MIR -Movimiento de Izquierda Revolucionaria.
This is divided into two factions:

Probably Pedro Garcia Flores, (former member of POR, and now a member of PRIN; officer ex com. FSTMB (inoperative since August 1971); he has visited both Moscow and Cuba.

b. Sanchez Valdivia, Gustavo

Usually referred to as Gustavo Sanchez Salazar brother of Ruben Sanchez Valdivia.

c. Flores Santos, Genaro

Farm-worker; political exile; arrived Chile by way of Chacalluta, (HOPA-10778, 29 October 1971,

d. Mina Thola, Pablo

No traces.

e. Santos Velasco, Soligno

No traces.

f. Velasco, Mario

In 1955 a Mario Velasco was listed as a member of the PCB in Oruro. In November 1964 a Mario Velasco, had arrived in Lima en route to exile in Brazil.

g. Condori Choque, Teofilo

Teofilo Condori Choque was arrested 14 March 1972 in La Paz for guerrilla activity. (HOPT-4958, 26 June 1972.) He may be identical with the Teofilo Condori Ccama who was picked up by the Peruvian police on 6 January 1968 near Cuzco: he said he was on a supply mission for Ricardo Ccama, "chief of Bolivian Communists", in Viacha. (26 January 1968.)

h. Tambo, Raymundo

Described by Prensa Latina, 19 July 1971, as an officer of CUB (Bolivian University Students Confederation) who had been invited to Havana to attend the 26 July festivities. Prensa Latina of 26 July 1971 described him as a representative of the Independent Peasant Bloc in the Popular Assembly.

q. *F u e n t e s, Jorge

A Jorge Fuentes was reported in HCSA-17251, 25 August 1971, as a presumed member of the MIR in Concepcion, Chile.

r. *M e n d o z a, Wilfredo

t. *V i l l a l o b o s Obando, Wenceslao

In 1970 he was a member of the PRIN and of the FSTMB Executive Committee.

w. *V e l a s q u e z, Ramiro or V e l a s c o, Ramiro.

Montevideo 2 September 1971 as an exile and departed for Santiago 10 September 1971. Letter of introduction to him in Antofagasta was given to a source who had agreed to join ELN. (DIRECTOR 192501, 19 October 1971.)

OR

(3) Julio Rojas, member of the JCB/C in Cochabamba, was visited in November - December 1968 by two Argentine students who were trying to contact the Bolivian guerrillas.

Jorge *C a d i m a Valdez, architect, arrived in Lima 26 August 1971 seeking political asylum.

He is probably identical with (Lt. Col) Ernesto *C a d i m a Valdez, who was on the G-2 Staff of the Bolivian Army in 1968; in June 1970 he attended a two-week intelligence course given in Bolivia by a U.S. Army Intelligence Mobile Training Team (MIT) from the Canal Zone.

kk. *C e j a s Tordoya, (Major) Simon

ll. C a n i d o, (Major) Rolando

(Major) Rolando *C a n i d o Viricochea [was co-chief of the State Intelligence Service (SIE) in the Ministry of Interior from about April to August 1971 He arrived in Lima 26 August 1971 seeking political asylum; and went to Brazil 23 September 1971.

mm. V i l l a r r o e l G., (Maj) Emilio

Major Emilio *V i l l a r r o e l Guzman [was co-chief of SIE from October 1970 to August 1971. He [left Bolivia for exile in Buenos Aires 9 September 1971, and then moved to Sao Paulo. According to one report dated 30 November 1971, he had been captured by Brazilian authorities on the Bolivian/Brazilian border as he attempted to reenter Bolivia.

nn. *C o s t a Eguino, (Captain) Edgardo

He arrived in Lima 26 August 1971 seeking political asylum and went to Santiago on 24 September 1971. He was one of the ten Ruben Sanchez reportedly was planning to infiltrate back into Bolivia from Chile.

Martinez (fnu), Bolivian exile in Santiago, was reported as a member of the ELN who was attending a guerrilla warfare training course in November 1971. (HOP-7043, 14 December 1971,

Lt. German Martinez was one of the ten officers Ruben Sanchez was reportedly planning to infiltrate back into Bolivia from Chile.

fff. *M e n a c h o Guzman, Jose Pedro (Police Lt.)

2nd Lt. Jose Pedro Menacho was one of the ten Ruben Sanchez was planning to infiltrate back into Bolivia from Chile.

ggg. *R i v e r o, fnu (Bolivian merchant), possibly identical with Sergio *R i v e r o, cited in Att. 6.

There was one old trace to a Sergio Rivero, classified t, but the document could not be found.

hhh. *B a l v i a n, Jorge @ "Coco"

Victor Jorge Balbian Rocha, an ELN member, was arrested in one of the earlier series of raids (late 1971 or early 1972) and was cooperating with the government. According to HOPT-4957, 17 July 1972, "Cocilo" Balvian, probably identical, had recently been killed.

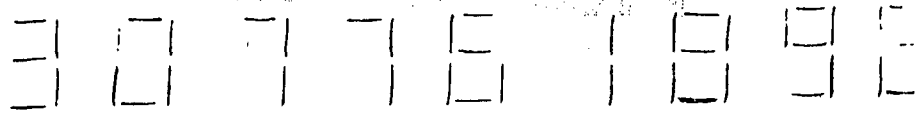

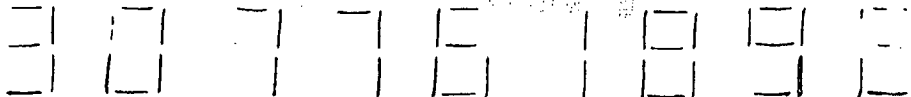

Gerardo Bermudez Rodriguez was the alias used in Bolivia by the Argentine Jose Faustino Sampedro [], member of the ELN. He, along with other members of the ELN General Staff, escaped to Chile in May - June 1972.

Probably Dr. Rene Flores Rodriguez [] appointed late February 1972 as official PRIN observer to the FRA.

Jaime Paz Zamora is related to both Oscar Zamora Medinacelli, of the PCB/C, and Victor Paz Estenssoro of the MNR. In 1969 he was a student at Louvian University, Louvian, Belgium, where he was reported by source as "rabid and dogmatic Marxist" and not trustworthy for the Cubans." In June 1972 reported that Paz headed the MIR and supported the extremist faction of the FRA.
