TUESDAY'S NEWSCASTS WERE ENTIRELY DOMINATED BY FRG CHANCELLOR  
KOHL'S VISIT TO MOSCOW.

OTHER INTERNATIONAL NEWS INCLUDED THE SITUATION IN CHAD, THE  
VISIT OF FRG LABOR MINISTER BLUEM TO TURKEY AND Y RUGOSLAVIA,  
FRG/FRENCH RELATIONS, THE ARRIVAL OF U.S. SECRETARY OF STATE  
SHULTZ IN DAMASCUS, THE GREEK PRESIDENCY OF THE EC, AND U.S.  
VICE PRESIDENT BUSH'S STATEMENT THAT HE WOULD EXPECT PRESIDENT  
REAGAN TO SEEK REELECTION.

DOMESTIC NEWS INCLUDED THE CALL OF SPD PARTY LEADER VOGEL ON  
THE U.S. AND THE USSR TO REACH AN AGREEMENT IN GENEVA, THE  
EXPECTED PEACE MOVEMENT DEMONSTRATIONS IN THE FRG AND THE SUPPORT  
OF LABOR UNIONS, THE TRAIN ACCIDENT IN THE GDR, THE FRG STEEL  
INDUSTRIES CRISIS, AND UNEMPLOYMENT IN THE FRG.

CHANNEL ONE'S POLITICAL MAGAZINE "PANORAMA" INCLUDED A REPORT ON  
THE COOPERATION BETWEEN EX-NAZI **KLAUS BARBIE** AND U.S. INTELLIGENCE

KOHL IN MOSCOW

BOTH CHANNEL NEWSCASTS REPORTED EXTENSIVELY WITH FILM ON THE  
VISIT OF FRG CHANCELLOR KOHL TO MOSCOW.

CHANNEL TWO'S DIRK SAGER (MOSCOW) SAID IN THE MAIN NEWS: "KOHL  
MET WITH ANDROPOV TODAY. THE SOVIET LEADER REGRETTED THAT HE  
WAS NOT ABLE TO SEE KOHL YESTERDAY. THE TWO LEADERS DISCUSSED ONLY  
QUESTIONS OF INTERNATIONAL SECURITY. ANDROPOV MADE CLEAR THAT THE  
USSR IS INTERESTED IN GOOD RELATIONS WITH THE FRG AND HE ACCEPTED  
KOHL'S INVITATION TO VISIT THE FRG. FRG FOREIGN MINISTER GENSCHER  
MET WITH HIS SOVIET COUNTERPART GROMYKO. THEY DISCUSSED THE  
STATIONING OF U.S. MISSILES IN WESTERN EUROPE, THE RELATIONS  
BETWEEN THE FRG AND THE USSR AND THE CSCE NEGOTIATIONS IN MADRID.  
IN THE AFTERNOON KOHL AND GENSCHER MET WITH SOVIET MINISTER  
PRESIDENT TICHINOV AND DEFENSE MINISTER USTINOV. (AVAILABLE ON  
VIDEO)

A STATEMENT BY FRG CHANCELLOR KOHL ADVOCATING A MEETING BETWEEN  
PRESIDENT REAGAN AND SOVIET LEADER ANDROPOV FOLLOWED. KOHL ALSO  
EMPHASIZED THAT HE DID NOT REACH AN AGREEMENT WITH ANDROPOV ON  
THE DISARMAMENT ISSUE AND THAT THERE IS STILL TIME TO REACH AN  
AGREEMENT IN GENEVA. (AVAILABLE ON VIDEO)

GUSTAV TRAMPE (MOSCOW) SAID IN CHANNEL TWO'S MAIN NEWS COMMEN-  
TARY: "THE FRG/SOVIET CONSULTATIONS DO NOT SEEM TO BE VERY FRUIT-  
FUL. THE SOVIETS HAVE NOT SHOWN ANY WILLINGNESS TO COMPROMISE ON THE  
DISARMAMENT ISSUE. THE EXPECTED POLITICAL DAMAGE RESULTING FROM  
THE STATIONING OF U.S. IBM'S IN WESTERN EUROPE MAY BE LIMITED  
BY THIS VISIT. ANDROPOV HAS AGREED TO VISIT BONN. THE SOVIETS ARE  
STILL INTERESTED IN MAINTAINING A DIALOGUE WITH BONN. (AVAILABLE

CHANNEL ONE'S MAIN NEWS INCLUDED AN INTERVIEW WITH CHANCELLOR  
KOHL ON FRG/SOVIET RELATIONS, THE PROGRESS IN GENEVA AND HIS  
CONSULTATIONS WITH ANDROPOV. (AVAILABLE ON VIDEO)

CHANNEL ONE'S LUTZ LEHMANN (MOSCOW) SAID IN THE MAIN NEWS:  
"ANDROPOV SEEMED IN GOOD HEALTH TODAY AFTER RECEIVING MEDICAL  
TREATMENT YESTERDAY. ANDROPOV MADE CLEAR THAT THE SOVIET POSITION

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ON DISARMAMENT REMAINS UNCHANGED. PRAVDA ONLY PUBLISHED EXCERPTS OF KOHL'S STATEMENTS. DIFFICULT TOPICS SUCH AS AFGHANISTAN WERE EXCLUDED. THE SOVIETS WANT TO MAINTAIN GOOD RELATIONS WITH THE FRG." (AVAILABLE ON VIDEO)

IN THE LATE NEWSCAST CHANNEL TWO'S GUSTAV TRAMPE (MOSCOW) AND HANS ALBERT (MOSCOW) INTERVIEWED A NUMBER OF FRG AND SWISS JOURNALISTS ON THEIR FIRST REACTIONS TO FRG CHANCELLOR KOHL'S MOSCOW VISIT. (AVAILABLE ON VIDEO)

IN THE LATE NEWS COMMENTARY CHANNEL TWO'S HANS ALBERT (MOSCOW) SAID: "THERE WAS NO NEW DOOR OPENED IN MOSCOW BUT, ON THE OTHER HAND, THERE WAS NO DOOR CLOSED HER. MOSCOW DID NOT SHOW ANY MOVEMENT ON THE DISARMAMENT ISSUE BUT CHANCELLOR KOHL ON THE OTHER HAND WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN ABLE TO PAY AN UNQUESTIONABLY HIGH PRICE FOR SUCH CONCESSIONS. KOHL MADE CLEAR THAT THE FRG STANDS FIRMLY BEHIND THE NATO CONCEPT UNDER U.S. LEADERSHIP...THE SOVIET THREAT THAT THE WARSAW PACT WOULD REACT TO THE STATIONING OF U.S. IBM'S IN WESTERN EUROPE WAS REPEATED BUT NO ADDITIONAL INFORMATION WAS PROVIDED. KOHL SUGGESTED THAT EVEN IF THERE IS NO AGREEMENT REACHED IN GENEVA THE DISARMAMENT NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN THE SUPER-POWERS SHOULD CONTINUE. THE FRG DELEGATION EXPRESSED OPTIMISM AS TO THE PROGRESS OF THE CSCE NEGOTIATIONS IN MADRID. IN THE LONG TERM THE SOVIETS WILL CONTINUE TO BE INTERESTED IN GOOD RELATIONS WITH THE FRG." CHANNEL ONE'S PETER BAUER (MOSCOW) SAID IN THE LATE NEWSCAST: "BOTH SIDES MADE IT CLEAR THAT THEY DID NOT MAKE ANY PROGRESS IN THE CRUCIAL DISARMAMENT QUESTIONS."
