KEY STORIES: ONCE AGAIN THE PAPERS ARE DELUGED WITH ARTICLES ABOUT THE FORTHCOMING GENERAL ELECTION. HOWEVER, OTHER KEY STORIES INCLUDES NEWS THAT FOREIGN MINISTER, SHIMON PERES, TODAY BEGINS TALKS IN WASHINGTON ABOUT THE CHANCES FOR CONVENING AN INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON MIDDLE EAST PEACE. REPORTED THAT KLAUS BARBIE'S RECENT ACTIVITIES AS INTELLIGENCE COLONEL IN THE BOLIVIAN ARMY AND AS A SECRET AGENT PROTECTED BY THE AMERICANS IN POST-WAR WEST GERMANY WERE REVEALED IN THE ASSIZE COURT YESTERDAY. THE U.K. IS REPORTED TO BE STEPPING UP ITS CO-OPERATION WITH THE UNITED STATES TO STOP BRITISH DEPENDENCIES IN THE CARIBBEAN BEING USED FOR THE MOVEMENT OF ILLEGAL DRUGS AND THE PROFITS FROM THEM. THE FIRST DIRECT MESSAGE FROM ANY OF THE WESTERN HOSTAGES IN BEIRUT FOR MORE THAN A MONTH CAME YESTEDAY IN A VIDEO TAPE OF ONE OF THE FOUR AMERICAN TEACHERS BEING HELD THERE. FINALLY, THERE WAS A REPORT THAT MORE THAN 6,900 NORTH AMERICANS INVADED THE CARIBBEAN PORT OF HONDURAS - FORTUNATELY - ONLY A MOCK BATTLE INTENDED TO PREPARE AMERICAN FORCES FOR A POSSIBLE ATTACK BY NICARAGUA.

BROADCAST MEDIA: EARLY MORNING TELEVISION AND RADIO LED WITH THE TWO LATEST OPINION POLLS WHICH PUT THE CONSERVATIVES IN A COMMANDING LEAD. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT TWO BRITISH TELEVISION JOURNALISTS WERE GIVEN 10 DAYS TO GET OUT OF SOUTH AFRICA LAST NIGHT. MICHAEL BUERK OF THE BBC AND PETER SHARP OF ITN WERE TOLD BY OFFICIALS THAT THEIR COVERAGE OF POLITICAL UNREST BROKE CENSORSHIP REGULATIONS. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT MRS. THATCHER WILL MAKE HER FIRST CAMPAIGN SPEECH TODAY, TO CONSERVATIVE SUPPORTERS IN PERTH, SCOTLAND. THE BBC'S MORNING TELEVISION PROGRAM SAID IT WOULD BE VERY MUCH 'SPEAKING TO THE CONVERTED' BUT NEVERTHELESS CONCEDED THAT IT WOULD BE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR MRS. THATCHER TO IMPROVE HER POPULARITY RATINGS IN A LABOR-FAVORED AREA.

ELECTION POLLS: EIGHTY-ONE PER CENT OF VOTERS BELIEVE MRS. THATCHER WILL WIN THE GENERAL ELECTION, A DAILY EXPRESS MARPLAN POLL REVEALS TODAY. THE SURVEY SHOWS THE TORIES 11 PER CENT AHEAD OF LABOR, WITH THE ALLIANCE IN THIRD PLACE. THE POLL, THE FIRST TO BE CONDUCTED SINCE MRS. THATCHER ANNOUNCED THE DATE OF THE ELECTION, SHOWS THE TORIES ON 41%, LABOR ON 30% AND THE ALLIANCE 26%. A SECOND POLL TODAY SHOWS MRS. THATCHER OF COURSE TO KEEP HER 140-SEAT MAJORITY INM THE COMMONS. THE MORI POLL FOR THE TIMES SHOWS THE TORIES STRONGLY AHEAD IN 73 KEY MARGINAL SEATS. IT IS INTERESTING TO NOTE THAT ALL THE PARTIES STAND ALMOST

EXACTLY WHERE THEY DID IN 1983. THE POLL REVEALED THAT THE VOTING SUPPORT WAS TORIES 41%, LABOR 33% AND ALLIANCE 24%. IF THIS VOTE WAS REPEATED ON JUNE 11, MRS. THATCHER WOULD BE RETURNED TO POWER WITH A UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 06 LONDON 10239
