Subject: Activities of the Stern Group in Egypt as revealed by the interrogation of Raphael Sadowsky.

Summary of Information:

1. Sadowsky was arrested on 22 Mar 45 in a Jewish cemetery near Cairo while looking for the location of the graves of Makin and Bet Suri, the Moyne murderers. Under interrogation by the Egyptian Police authorities, he admitted membership of the Stern Group to which he was recruited in 1943 by Joseph Sytnor, leader of the Group in Egypt.

2. Until the period immediately before the murder of Lord Moyne, Sadowsky's main function appears to have been that of liaison and his task was principally to keep the members of the gang in touch with one another through meetings with Sytnor, leader of the Group in Egypt, and other members of the Group.

3. Over four months before the Moyne murder Sadowsky had been told by Sytnor that two members of the Group would be arriving in Egypt to carry out an important job and he was asked to try and find a room for them. Sadowsky was the first contact of both Makin and Bet Suri on their arrival in Cairo and kept them in touch with Sytnor.

4. Sytnor came to Cairo twice during Makin's stay in Egypt. On the first occasion Sytnor, Sadowsky, Makin and an A.T.S. auxiliaries, Cassin Lourie, met in a Cairo cafe and Sytnor announced that the Stern headquarters had decided to kill Lord Moyne. Immediately after this meeting Sytnor, Makin and Sadowsky reconnoitered the area where Lord Moyne's offices were situated.

5. After the crime, had the two managed to escape, they were to leave Cairo in uniform, leaving their civilian clothes to be collected by Sadowsky from a Cairo flower shop.

6. The main feature of Sadowsky's interrogation has been the number of names he has provided of persons who are members of or connected with the Stern Group in Egypt. The most important are listed below and fitted as far as possible into their proper place in the Sadowsky case. All the military personnel concerned are Palestinian, the civilians either Egyptian or domiciled in Egypt.

a. No. 774133 Lt.A.C. Josef Sytnor, alias Joseph Sytnor, alias Ben Zvi.

(1) According to Sadowsky, Sytnar until recently was the leader of the Stern Group in Egypt. He had been three years with the R.A.F. in Cairo and one year in Alexandria and frequented the Jewish clubs in these two towns where he was known as Ben Zvi. He was an export gun runner, arranged the distribution in Egypt of the Stern Group pamphlet "Front de Combat Hébreu" and arranged the firing of leave passes and documents for members of the Group to enter various camps. He is said to have had direct access to the leader of the Group in Palestine.

(2) In Sept 44 information received from Jewish Agency sources indicated that an attempt was to be made against the Delegates to the Pan-Arab Congress which opened at Alexandria on 25 Sept. Sytnar, with two Jewish Naval personnel, was arrested and interrogated in Alexandria, but it was not possible to prove that he had any intention of committing any crime against the Congress. He was therefore released. Sadowsky has confirmed that an attack on the Congress was in fact planned and that Sytnar would take part in it.

(3) At the request of SIME he was posted to an R.F. Station in Palestine in Nov 44. On the day after the arrest of Sadowsky, he disappeared from his unit and has not so far been traced.

b. No. Pal/17982 Pte. S.M. Strussman.

Sadowsky described Strussman as a close contact of Joseph Sytnar both in Egypt and in Palestine. Strussman's main pre-occupation before he was posted to C.M.F. was the collection of arms, detonators, dynamite, hand-grenades, etc., which he passed to Sytnar to hide and transport to Palestine. Arrangements are at present being made for his discharge from the Armed Forces and internment in Palestine.

c. No. V/Pal/195201 Rova Carola Martin. SECRET

(1) Lourie, even before Sadowsky joined the group 18 months ago, was in very close touch with Sytnar and was in fact his personal assistant. She acted as his agent for the group between Egypt and Palestine and was engaged in gun-running and the distribution of the Stern Group publication "Chaita".

(2) She attended the first meeting which took place between Sadowsky, Hakim and Sytnar in Cairo, and was almost certainly aware of the plan to murder Lord Moyne. At this meeting she announced her intention of leaving the group, but Sadowsky cannot say whether or not she was allowed to leave, although he never heard of her afterwards.

(3) She was recently discharged from the Forces and interned in Palestine.

d. No. W/Pal/203416 Yaffa Orbach.

(1) Sadowsky states that Yaffa was one of the most active members of the Stern Group in Egypt and was placed under the orders of Sytnor by the H.Q. of the Group. She also acted as messenger between Sytnor and Yosi Feinberg, a member of the Group stationed at Mecca, who was killed in a train accident on 6 Dec 44.

(2) She was allotted by Sytnor to Makin as a companion during his stay in Cairo and on at least one occasion accompanied Makin on a reconnaissance of Lord Moyne's house. She has recently been discharged from the Forces for internment in Palestine.

e. No. Pal/45451 Sjt. Benjamin Gerner.

(1) Previous to Mar 45 Gerner was employed on commando work for I.S.O. in Italy. He carried out his work extremely well and was discharged from the Army in Mar 45 because of an infection of the eyes.

(2) It was afterwards reported to SIME that Gerner was a member of the Stern Group and this information Sadowsky confirmed.

(3) Prior to his departure for C.M.F. in Sept 44 he was in very close contact with Sytnor and Cassia Lourie in Egypt.

(4) He was on leave in Cairo during the trial of the Moyne murderers and took to Stern H.Q. in Palestine a complete and uncensored account of the trial which had been prepared by Albert Starazolsky, a Cairo journalist and President of the A.Z.O. in Cairo.

(5) He also told Sadowsky that he had brought back from Italy in Jan 45 a V/T transmitting set for use by the Stern Group here. This has been confirmed by King Borantimio, a Stern operative in Cairo the V/T set was left behind in Palestine. He has now been interned in Palestine.

f. No. Pal/13259 Sjt. Rubin Franco.

(1) In Dec 44 Franco arrived at C.S.D.I.C. Sub-Centre M.E.P., Maadi, from C.M.F.

(2) Sadowsky states that while Franco was employed at C.S.D.I.C. 30 terrorists released from Asmara passed through Maadi en route to Palestine, and claims that Franco was able to inform them of the existence of a special listening apparatus in the Camp.

(3) The interrogation of Mrs. Sarah Anis revealed that Sjt. Franco delivered Gerner's V/T set at his insistence to Stern Headquarters in Palestine.

(4) Franco has recently been discharged from the Forces and interned in Palestine.

g. No. Pal/2597 Tsvi Feinberg.

(1) Feinberg was killed in a train accident at Haeser on 6 Dec 44.

(2) His death was investigated at the time but there was nothing to indicate that he was a member of a terrorist organization.

(3) Sadovsky, however, has thrown new light on Feinberg. He states that he was one of the Stern Group leaders in Egypt, that it was he who brought from Palestine the revolvers used to kill Lord Moyne, and was an important link in the smuggling of arms through Imsilia from Egypt to Palestine.

h. No. Pal/3084 Abu Arval Kuritzky.

Kuritzky, according to Sadovsky, was a close friend of Gepner and was also employed in the running of operations in Palestine and Egypt. He was Feinberg's second-in-command in Imsilia prior to Feinberg's death in Dec 44. Kuritzky carried the Moyne murderers' arms from Feinberg in Imsilia to Sadovsky at whose house he delivered them in Sept 44. Sadovsky in his turn delivered them to Hakim.

i. Albert Staraselsky.

Staraselsky has been a known member of the New Zionist Organization in Cairo for some considerable time. Sadovsky is vague as to whether or not he was a member of the Stern Group, but considers on the whole that he was not. He has, however, been for some time in touch with members of the Stern Group, especially with Gepner and Franco and has admitted under interrogation supplying Gepner with a copy of the account of the trial of the Moyne murderers. This account was subsequently delivered by Gepner to Stern H.Q. in Palestine. He is at present under interrogation by the Cairo City Police.

j. H/IX 501954 FBI - Arnold Horowitz, C-1 SC 4473

(1) Horowitz was interrogated at the same time as Sytnor in Alexandria in connection with the proposed attempt on the Pan-Arab Congress. There was no evidence to support his participation in this and he was released.

(2) Sadovsky, however, states that he was without a doubt a member of the Stern Group and that he was Mr. Horowitz's second in command in Alexandria. He used Jewish serviceman's identity.

Alexandria as post-boxes for arms and explosives and was a specialist in the distribution of leaflets and other propaganda material. Horowitz is at present interned in Palestine.

K. No. 2992191 LACN. Ruth Greenbaum, S.A. (CITRENSYR)

(1) During the stay of Hakim in Cairo, Greathead, with Yaffa Greenberg, was seen by Sadovsky in the company of Sytnar and Hakim. Sadovsky states that in Sept 44 when Sytnar was arrested in Alexandria she helped to hide material which was in his possession and which would have incriminated him very seriously.

(2) On at least one occasion she went with Hakim to reconnoiter the neighborhood of Lord Moyne's house.

(3) She has recently been discharged from the service and interned in Palestine.
