The division of Germany into two administrative zones has enabled Himmler to seize some administrative posts which he has confided to SS chiefs. Until now these posts were controlled by the Martin Bormann, Chief of the Reich Chancellery.

Thus the northern part of the Reich no longer is in the control of Bormann but of SS Hellmuth Friedrich, one of Himmler's adjutants. The administrative center of this part of the Reich is at Hlensburg (Schleswig-Holstein). The administration of the southern part of the country is at Efullach, in Bavaria, under the direction of Bormann. At Munich, however, civil affairs have been confided to the direction of the SS chiefs Vogler and von Eberstein, who replace the Gauleiter Giesler and the mayor of the city, Fiehler.
