A. INTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES IN FINLAND

I. HISTORICAL SURVEY

1917-1941

The position of the Germans in Finland was somewhat different from that in the three Baltic States. Their number in Finland was not large (about 1,400 in 1938), and although the Finns were hardly kinder of them than were the Lithuanians, the Latvians or the Estonians, they had three important assets and tended to be obscured by the ever present menace of Russia. Indeed it was on the basis of common antipathy to the Soviets that Germany was able to gain a foothold in Finland and build up an intelligence system there.

In 1937, the Germans tried to obtain a fishery concession in the Petsamo area which would have enabled them to base a German fishing fleet there and to lay down stocks of fuel. On the request being refused, the Germans became persistent, and the Finnish Government decided to look more closely into the scheme. When it was discovered that Reino SPINS and Edmund von FRUNDT were amongst its procurers, it became evident that its primary purpose was to provide cover for intelligence work.

A year later, on the occasion of the twentieth anniversary of the Finnish war of liberation, a party of German officers and ex-officers visited Finland. Amongst them was Oberst Carl SEHR, an accredited member of the Abwehr, whose behaviour moved that he was more interested in endeavouring to establish connections for the purpose of exchanging information on Russia than in the celebrations. He was probably selected because he was in charge of the Finnish Air Force in 1919-1920 and was one of the German officers who remained in Finland when von der Goltz' troops were withdrawn. He returned to Germany shortly before the present war.

In June 1939, Admiral CANARIS, chief of the Abwehr, accompanied by Oberst Hans von ~~FRUNDT~~ head of Abteilung I, and Oberst Ernst von ~~FRUNDT~~ head of Abteilung III of the Abwehr, visited Helsinki and met both the chief of the Finnish I.S. and ~~Col. Colonel~~ ROTHMANN, then head of the Russian section of the Intelligence Service of the Finnish General Staff. What happened at this meeting is obscure, but it may be worth mentioning that, in May, Lt. Colonel L. F. STRÖM, director of a special section in the

Finnish I.S. charged with the observation of the Russian Fleet, went to Berlin to confer, it was said, with his German opposite numbers.

II. ABWEHR

Development

5. The outbreak of hostilities between Germany and Russia and the entry of Finland into this conflict, began a period of collaboration between the Finnish Military Intelligence and the counter-espionage branch of the police on the one hand, and the Abwehr on the other. The Abwehr was organized under Freigattenmajster CELLARIUS, who was also head of the German-Estonian military staff established at Helsinki. He was born in Riga in 1898, had a Russian mother and is stated to speak fluent Russian. He still uses his original name of KELLER as a pseudonym. He first appeared in Finland in 1939, when he was appointed Assistant German Naval Attache for Finland, Estonia and Latvia and also for Sweden. CELLARIUS spent most of his time in the German Legation at Tallinn, recruiting Estonians for intelligence work against Russia.

6. CELLARIUS was originally assisted by a certain Major BLOCH, in charge of counter-espionage, and had two liaison officers, Major LINDBLAD and Lieutenant HUBITZ, attached to the IInd Section of the Finnish General Staff at Mikkeli. Major BLOCH was in touch with the Finnish Lt. Col. SAUTSUO, who was aided by a Finnish Dr. KASTARI. Other employees were Frauoin BIRCK, his secretary, Frauoin HELSINGIUS, and Marineoberführer HORN.

7. Major BLOCH left Helsinki early in 1943 and is now reported to be at Vichy. Marineoberführer HORN was transferred from Helsinki about May 1943 for service with the German Navy. A certain Hauptmann PAUL, one of BLOCH'S subordinate officers since 1941, left Finland in July 1943, and an unconfirmed report stated that he had been killed in an aeroplane crash.

8. The present organization is generally known as the "BERNESE CELLARIUS", but its official title is "K.O. (Kriegsorganisation) Finnland". Its headquarters are in Helsinki and there are branch stations at Rovaniemi, Mikkeli and Petsamo. Its headquarters are in Helsinki.

Oberstleutnant HOFFING-SEEBOURG - in charge of operational intelligence.

Major DEIBLICH is believed to have succeeded Major Heinz HAGEL, who was in charge of contre-espionage and deputy head of the Abwehr until December 1943, when he was removed from his post and ordered to return to Germany apparently as a result of his intrigues against CELLARIUS.

9. CELLARIUS, who is on bad terms with almost every German departmental head in Finland, is reported to have lost all his former influence in RIGA and TALLINN. There is some reason to suppose that he has, in fact, reduced the scope of his intelligence activities in the above capitals. If this be so, it is due, less to interdepartmental German quarrels than to an increasing preoccupation with the organization of agents for post-armistice intelligence work in Finland, should that country decide to surrender to the Allies.

10. Branch Stations.

The Abwehr stations at Rovaniemi and Mikkeli (the Finnish C.H.Q.) exist mainly for the purpose of liaison with the military authorities, but a certain Major PAULUS was reported during 1943 to be engaging in operational espionage from the latter station. The Petsamo station keeps in touch with another Abwehr station at Kirkenes, Norway; its main objective is the observation of Allied and Russian shipping in the Murmanak region.

III. THE SICHERHEITSDIENST

Activities and Aims.

11. Whereas the Abwehr is the Intelligence organization of the High Command, the Sicherheitsdienst is subordinate to Himmler, and is concerned with every phase of activity in Germany or abroad which may affect the policy or stability of the Nazi party. In Finland the S.D. has two main tasks. The first is to exercise surveillance over every aspect of Finnish life which might affect German interests. The second has an immediate connection

for information on leading personalities of every kind - political, commercial, military or academic - for details of movements and societies, whether pro-Nazi or otherwise, and for information on Finnish relations with neighbouring or ethnically related nations, (e.g. Nordism, Finno-Ugric exchanges). It becomes the S.D.'s duty to ensure that the Reichsicherheitshauptamt in Berlin is fully informed on the reliability or otherwise of every public figure of importance in Finland. Pro-Nazi organisations like the I.K.L. are exploited as sources of information, and fluctuations of Finnish policy are carefully plotted. The S.D. is particularly interested in Finnish reactions to the changing fortunes of the Axis powers, and was spurred to unusual activity at the time of Mussolini's downfall. In addition to this close observation of Finnish affairs, the S.D. has a second main task, the collection of political intelligence concerning the Allied powers and the study of the reactions of the diplomatic representatives of the various foreign governments still represented in Finland. In this latter connection attempts have been made to penetrate the Brazilian and U.S. Legations, but there is as yet no positive proof that such penetration has been effected. It is well known that Berlin is continually calling for political intelligence reports, and there are indications that many of those supplied are fictitious and are submitted because admissions of failure are not well regarded in Nazi circles. There is no present evidence of any post-occupational planning, either from the point of view of intelligence or of sabotage.

Organisation

12. Information on the organisation of the S.D. in Finland is very scanty.

Its chief is Alaric BROSS, accredited representative of the Deutsche Amerika Liga, who has recently become the representative of the "Edsener Nationalzeitung" as well. Through Dr. SAUERZGER, formerly Executive Head of the S.D. in Estonia, BROSS was put in touch with ANTHONI, until January 1944 pro-Nazi chief of the Finnish State Police, and he is also in a position to obtain high grade information from leading pro-Nazi Finnish personalities. BROSS' official position is obscure, but it is certain that his Finnish contacts recognise that he is an important representative

in Finland, who is also in charge of Gestapo activity. Obersturmführer Konstantin HELLMAN, the Jaffan S.S. representative in Finland, occupies an important position in the S.D. in Finland, and is reported to be connected with C.E. work. There are indications that a certain Harald NIETZ, allegedly a journalist, is an important member of the Gestapo in Finland, and that Hans METZGER, the German Press Attaché in Helsinki, is his deputy. Gustav SCHMALFUSS is reported to work for METZGER and three Germans (EROSLÖF, HEYBÜCK and Rittmeister VOSS) and two Finns, (Untersturmbannführer DOLM and Sturmführer Janko H. ILLI) have been identified. EROSLÖF has now left Finland. It is not known whether the present chief of the organization Totit in Helsinki, ~~Frank~~ ~~Arvid~~ Architect ~~FRANKIUS~~, is assisting the S.D., but his predecessor, ~~August~~ ~~VIERCUTS~~, and his deputy ~~BERNARD~~ ^{FRU} did so and it is common practice for this organization to provide cover for S.D. personnel. Rittmeister VOSS, mentioned above, is a case in point; he is ostensibly a Totit employee.

IV. JAPANESE INTELLIGENCE

Armed Forces Intelligence.

13. The Japanese Military Attaché, Colonel Hiroshi ONOCHI, maintains a steady exchange of information with the Finnish General Staff. He is chiefly interested in the Russian and Anglo-American forces, but according to reliable reports, also concerns himself with the Wehrmacht. He maintains a particularly close contact through his assistant, Major Eitzi KUROSE, with the Hungarian Military Attaché, Captain Frederick KIBON.

Economic Intelligence.

14. The Japanese Intelligence Service is known to be interesting itself in particular business concerns in Finland, though the reason for this interest is not known. They are:

- i. The OUREN, tobacco agent, Universitetsgt. 25, Espo.
- ii. P. C. REITHE & Co., tobacco buyers, Mannant. 4, Espo.
- iii. A/B ALGOL, Oulungst. 22; Helsinki.
- iv. SÖREN BERGER & Co., Södra Kajen 4, Helsinki (a firm interested in fodder and Far Eastern goods).

Japanese interest in A/B ALGOL seems to be focussed on U. DUNKEL, the head of the oil, fats and chemicals department. A partner of the firm SCHEER & Co. with whom the Japanese are in contact is Fritz ACHILLES, formerly Austrian Consul General. He has close commercial links with Germany and is a member of the Nazi-controlled "DEUTSCHE KOLONIE" organization.

V. LIAISON WITH THE FINNISH AUTHORITIES

Military Intelligence

15. The department of the Finnish General Staff which deals with military intelligence is the IIInd Section. Its head, Colonel Alander PAASIKEN, who is half Hungarian, is pro-Axis. He collaborated with ANTHONI (q.v.) in anti-allied measures when the latter was head of the State Police. According to an unconfirmed report, PAASIKEN was recently replaced by Col. VALDEN who is not pro-German. Other officers of the IIInd Section known or suspected to have pro-Axis sympathies are :-

Col. RAUTSUO, head of the contre-espionage bureau.

Major Erik PALKO, reported to be an expert on cryptography.

Major Otto Kalervo RANTANE, connected with air force intelligence.

There is evidence that the Finns collaborate with the Germans in sending agents into Russian territory. For this purpose the Finns had (and may still have) a branch office at Viipuri.

Police

16. The Valtionlinen Poliisi (State Police) share with the C.2. section of the General Staff responsibility for combatting foreign intelligence activities. Its head, from the commencement of the 2nd Russo-Finnish war until January 1944, was Arno Kalervo ANTHONI, who was completely subservient to the Germans and imprisoned pro-Allied Finns and Jews. He was in touch with BROSE, head of the S.D., and maintained close liaison with SIKKESBERG, formerly executive head of the S.D. in Estonia, to whom he furnished details of Estonian refugees who escaped to Finland. ANTHONI'S successor, Dr. Paavo LESTARI, while not very satisfactory from the Allied point of view, as he was formerly employed Col. RAUTSUO'S contre-espionage bureau

and was his link with CELLERINO, is lately reported to have shown signs of a more democratic outlook.

Other pro-Nazi members of the State Police are :-

Karlo Oskar LOPVENS, head of the supervisory department.

Arno Valterri KOVERO, head of the passport department.

B. GERMAN INTELLIGENCE IN THE BALTIC STATES

L. ABWYER

Early History

1. Up to 1933, German Intelligence work in the Baltic States was negligible. Such operations as there were, were based on Königsberg and were directed against the U.S.S.R. The instruments, chosen from among the German residents, were usually the representatives of German firms. Thus, the agent for OPEL in Riga, Erik JÜRGENS, and the ZWISS representative in TALLINN, G. WÄLTER, were among those employed by the German I.S. while German ships engaged on traffic in the Baltic were used to carry reports and instructions. There was also in Königsberg a small organization whose function it was to further German claims to the Memel Territory and to supply the German I.S. with information of military interest. This was directed by the German Consul, (Dr.) STARK, and a certain SCHLIER, while Baron ROLF acted as the link with the German I.S. station in Königsberg. German diplomatic representatives also played a prominent part in these schemes. One of them, (Hauptmann) FLEHN of the German Legation in Riga, was known, as far back as 1934, to be organizing a German intelligence network in the Baltic States.

2. To cover these clandestine activities, the Germans organized a strong counter-espionage system with the object of ensuring the safety of their own organization, and extensive use was made of German natives in the Baltic Provinces for this purpose. An example of the above was brought to light in May 1939, when four Latvian reserve officers, including a lieutenant-colonel, were convicted of espionage on behalf of Germany and sentenced to varying terms of imprisonment. They had been in regular contact with Königsberg.

1939-1940.

3. After the outbreak of hostilities between Germany and Poland, the sudden repatriation of the Baltic considerably decreased the number of resident Germans available as agents, and there is reason to suppose that, in later arrangements made for the continued existence of the German I.S. in the

Baltic States, the personnel of the organizations set up to deal with the liquidation of the properties of emigrant Balts played a considerable part.

It was reported in July 1940 that 90% of the German I.S. in Estonia were members of this body, working under von ~~WALTHER~~^{FOH} who had been the local representative of SIEMENS for 9 years. In Latvia, a captain Kurt ~~BOHN~~^{BOHN}, head of the pedigree research section of the "UTAC" (Ungeduldigs-Freihand-gesellschaft) was thought in February 1940 to be head of the German I.S. An important pre-war agent was Korvettenkapitän Alexander ~~CELLARIUS~~^{CELLARIUS} (see above) who, in November 1939, was appointed as assistant to the German Naval Attache in Finland, Kapitän (now Admiral) von ~~BOHN~~^{BOHN} (not to be confused with the well-known Abwehr officer, Kapitän zur See Udo von ~~BOHN~~^{BOHN}). ~~CELLARIUS~~^{CELLARIUS}, who was posted to the German Legation in Tallinn and Riga, immediately set to work to enlist educated Estonians and Latvians for intelligence work against the Russians. He aroused suspicion prior to the war by travelling on an ordinary German passport in which he was described as "Kaufmann". His bill at the "Grand Hotel" in Helsinki was paid, however, by the Finnish General Staff.

Recent Reorganization.

When Finland went to war with Russia in 1941, ~~CELLARIUS~~^{CELLARIUS} reappeared in the dual capacity of Leiter of the Abwehr in Finland and chief of the German-Finnish Military Staff which was established in Helsinki. He exercised considerable influence over those Abwehr stations which were established at Riga and Tallinn as soon as the Germans occupied the Baltic States. The station at Riga was known as "Abwehrstelle Ostland" and was under the control of Freigattkapitän ~~LIEBENKÖTTL~~^{LIEBENKÖTTL}, assisted by Oberstleutnant ~~GRUBE~~^{GRUBE} (sabotage), Major ~~WISTULA~~^{WISTULA} (counter-espionage) and Hauptmann Dr. ~~KRUSEMANN~~^{KRUSEMANN}. Subsidiary offices were opened at Tallinn (with Major ~~SCHWITZ~~^{SCHWITZ} and Kapitän ~~WIEGAND~~^{WIEGAND} in charge) and at Minsk (under the control of Kapitän ~~FRIDTJEF~~^{FRIDTJEF}, assisted by Hauptmann ~~FRIDTJEF~~^{FRIDTJEF} and Oberstleutnant ~~FRIDTJEF~~^{FRIDTJEF}). By April 1942 the Tallinn station had become independent of Abwehrstelle Ostland, but during 1943 it was completely reorganized and most of its personnel were changed. In May, Oberstleutnant ~~HANNEN~~^{HANNEN}, who had succeeded

SCHEWITZ as head of the station, was recalled and court-martialed. A succession of officers took his place for short periods, two of them being Oberst KLEP and Major STROCH, until about August 1943 when Major VOET was finally appointed in charge of the station with Major FROST as his deputy and his C.E. officer. Korvettenkapitän LINDBERG was given charge of the naval intelligence section (vice Korvettenkapitän WIDEGREN) in July 1943. The fortunes of Abwehrstelle Ostland appear to have been more stable; at least Major HESTER was still in charge of C.E. activities in August 1943.

Estonian Assistance to the Abwehr.

A number of Estonian officers joined the staff of the Tallinn station as soon as it was formed. These included Colonel KURK, Major CHRISTIAN, Major (now Col.) KUPWELL, Colonel SWARSEN, and Korvettenkapitän LINDBERG. Their main duty appears to have been the recruitment of Estonian agents for service with the Abwehr. The chief field for recruitment was Estonian patriotic organizations such as the "ERNA" group of parachutists, which flew from Finland to Estonia in 1941 and fought the Russians under Colonel ERIC. In the autumn of 1942, Colonel KURK went to Riga and attempted to recruit English speaking agents from this organization. A number of the "ERNA" men were also recruited by Major CHRISTIAN. One of these, REVENT, was employed with another in photographing visitors to the U.S. Legation in Helsinki. There can be no doubt but that these men were working under Sonderführer SCHWARZ (see above), who is known to employ Estonians.

II. THE SICHERHEITSDIENST

6. The organization and functions of the S.D. in the Baltic States are similar to those in other occupied territories. Obergruppenführer and General der Polizei F. WICKELM is reliably reported to be in charge of all S.D. activities in these states and also in White Ruthenia. He combines this office (as do most of his subordinates) with control of Sicherheitspolizei activity in the same area.

S.D. in Estonia.

7. The head of the S.D. is S.S. Oberführer und Polizeioberst MÜLLER. Under him was Sturmbannführer Dr. SAUBERGER, who left for Italy in September 1943, and was replaced by S.S. Sturmbannführer Dr. FITZ. During his term of office, SAUBERGER maintained close relations with the head of the S.D. in Finland, BROSS, and with NIEMI, head of the Finnish "Valtiollinen Poliisi" (State Police). Under SAUBERGER, S.D. heads were appointed in the Estonian police prefectures of Pärnu, Tartu, Tallinn, Narva, and presumably in the remaining five prefectures also. Dr. SEEFELD, head of the S.D. in Tartu, was at the same time SAUBERGER'S deputy for the whole of Estonia. He also left for Italy in September, and the present deputy head of the S.D. in Estonia is a certain FISCHER (probably S.S. Hauptsturmführer FISCHER who is known to have held a high position in the Sicherheitspolizei at Tartu). Little is known of the S.D. personnel in other districts. A sturmbannführer GEISSLER was reported as one of SAUBERGER'S departmental heads, and an Obersturmführer BERGMAN noted in a similar capacity.

Estonian assistance to the S.D.

8. The S.D. is forced to rely to a great extent on indigenous organizations to carry out its policy, a tendency which is, if anything, increasing if credence is given to recent reports that a number of S.D. personnel have been transferred to Denmark since September 1943. These native organizations include the police (both the security and criminal branches) and the "Self-Defence Corps" (KALITSE), which have a joint R.Q. and are controlled by a "Directorate of Police and Self-Defence" responsible to Dr. MAE, head of the Estonian Quilting Government, and also to MÜLLER. The whole police and self-defence organizations are thus at the disposal of the Germans. The practical effect of this arrangement is to secure for the S.D. full cooperation in the matter of suspected enemy agents, and to give them access to criminal records concerning crimes and political fugitives. There is evidence, too, that the Estonian Legion is sometimes used by the S.D. for the purpose of espionage.

S.D. in Latvia.

9. The head of the S.D. in Latvia is reported to be General SCHEIDER, who has his headquarters in the Parliament Building in Riga. Three of his subordinate officers are (or were) Sturmbannführer Dr. LUKKE (reported in April 1942 to be a high official of the S.D.); Obersturmbannführer Franz NÄKKE (a German Kriminal Kommissar working under LUKKE); and Sturmbannführer KIRSI (mentioned in July 1942 as "connected with" the S.D. in Latvia).

S.D. in Lithuania.

10. The supreme head of the Sicherheitspolizei and Sicherheitsdienst is reported to be a certain WISCHKI.

III. GERMAN AND FINNISH POST-OCCUPATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS.

11. Both the Finns and the Germans have organized intelligence services in Estonia to become operative in the event of a Russian occupation of that country. These services are independent of one other. According to a recent report, the Finnish organization is led by an Estonian lieutenant-commander under the direction of Col. VALLEN (see above). It has approximately 100 members in Estonia and is led by two Estonians with considerable experience of intelligence work, mainly attained through cooperation with the Germans. A wireless communication service has been organized, with three stations which broadcast from Estonia to Finland. No details of the German organization are at present available.
