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- J. WURNEY Report UNITED Vienna Operation: BENERARM mentioned that upon returning to duty, United had written a somewhat strange report on the Vienna operation. The report gave a brief resume of the background of UNIVIET and went on to explain in sweeping terms how successful and important UNIVIET meeting with the RIS had been. BERNHARDT said UNIVORSY had sent copies of his report to UTILITY, GWINERSTEIN, and BERNHARDT, himself. FURNING commented that someone from the UPHILL front office had come running to him brandishing UNIVISY's report, had asked if FIRMING knew anything about UNIVIET, and then asked if such an incredible operation could be real. FURNING added that the person in question did not have much of a CE mentality and it was interesting that even such a person reacted as he did to UNIVIETS's strange report. When asked how it was possible that an old pro like UNIVIETS' could write a report that gould cause so such reaction. FURNING splied that he thought UNIVIEWSY had become careless. (COMMENT: will attempt to get a copy of UNIVIEWSY's report later from FURNING.)
- 6. United meeting with the RIS; When asked what antended transpired, during UNING a meeting with the RIS, REPURARUT and FIRMING gave the following brief rundown:
 - a.
