Born: November 27, 1915 in Korca, Albania.

Education: Graduated from French Lycee (High School and Preparatory College).  
Graduated with Doctor of Law degree from University of Bologna,  
Bologna, Italy.

Career: In Italy at start of World War II and forced to remain there.  
During this time, earned living practising law under law firm  
in Italy.

After liberation of Italy, worked for International News Service  
until November 5, 1946. First was translator - English to  
Italian, French to Italian and vice versa. Then distributor of  
American articles to Italian newspapers. Also inspected three  
subsidiary offices of INS in Northern Italy at Geneva, Torino and  
Trieste. Later appointed chief secretary of INS for Northern  
Italy.

November 22, 1946, came to U.S. Started monthly magazine in  
Albanian and English and was its editor. Magazine, "The  
Albanian Bridgeporter" lasted for sixteen months. Its purpose  
was educational, cultural and social.

March 1949. Headquarters of the Army Language School, Presidio  
of Monterey, California, asked him to teach in the School but  
could not take the job since he was not yet an American citizen.

1949 Correspondent for the Italian paper "Il Corriere del  
Connecticut."

June 1949. Bridgeport Broadcasting Company called him to direct  
the Italian Hour. Presently associated with this Company, directs  
the Albanian Hour, Sundays 8:10-8:45, and half hour Italian  
program Sundays 9:30-10:00 a.m.

Had daily Italian programs until March 1950 when Company cancelled  
all weekday foreign programs.

Now teaches Italian and French to private pupils

Became U. S. citizen September 1949.

Married to American born girl, has son aged eight months.
