1. We appreciate receipt of reference notifying us that POA for CABATON-20 has been extended for 90 days to 30 June 1958.

2. Our second meeting with Subject was held on 3 March in Frankfurt at which time DIVOT-1 again requested Subject to notify him immediately of any letters that Subject might receive for DS-739. Subject agreed without question to do this favor for his former chief, DS-739. DIVOT-1's report #110 on this meeting is transmitted as an attachment under separate cover.

3. It is apparent that CABATON-20 is unwitting of the real nature of his agreement to serve as a letter address for DS-739. Although we would prefer to keep him unwitting, we shall postpone this decision until after the arrival of our first letter from Bohumil HUMMEL. In the meantime, we believe it is premature after only two meetings with Subject to complete PRQ Part II. We hope to accomplish this, however, after we have tested Subject's usefulness to the HUMMEL operation and before expiration of his POA.

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STEIN

Meeting of 1 March 1958 in FRANKFURT/M

Ref: Report # 57 dated 11 July 1957

Mr. Stein came to FRANKFURT/M on 3 March 1958. He arrived by train at 09:30 and I met him at the station. The purpose of his visit was to discuss the possibility of sending messages to him if he receives any letters or telegrams. He should have had over 100 letters and telegrams which I considered necessary to use Mr. Edmund HEMPEL from WEIMAR as STEIN's address by THOMAS for communication purposes and we hope that HEMPEL will attend a Conference in BRUSSELS in May 1958. Also, THOMAS has a letter addressed to the CIA and since he has in a correspondence indicated that STEIN would happen that STEIN would think that now he should send received messages to THOMAS instead to me.

After STEIN'S arrival I took him for a coffee to Cafe SCHWARZE opposite the Main Station and later for a lunch in PIVOY Hotel. During the conversation with STEIN I explained to him that I have a check to my father post office and I will send a message to THOMAS that he has and, therefore, our arrangements about the message received message to be immediately after receipt shall be made and remains in force. I instructed STEIN that after receipt of any letter, telegram or any other message destined for THOMAS he should call me by telephone number (FRANKFURT 29249) and we shall arrange how and when I shall call the message to me. If he does not reach me during his first telephone call he shall continue calling the given number in regular intervals until he reaches me.

STEIN said that he fully understands these instructions and that I can rely on him to carry them out as I wish. He is willing to deliver the message to me in person in Germany in person provided that I will pay his travelling expenses from home except for a few days during Easter 1958. His wife intend to pay a visit to some relatives in the Ruhr area. Before his departure he will instruct the local post office to deliver the mail to his relatives address during these vacations. STEIN departs from FRANKFURT by train to 14:00 hrs.

During this meeting I paid STEIN DM 40.- as his travelling expenses for this trip.
