SUBJECT: Operational/Procurement of Letter Drops

1. In partial fulfillment of your request for letter drops, [] in accordance with your desire as described in paragraph 9 of reference A, approached Major General Alexandros NITSINAS, Director of the Greek Central Intelligence Service (KYP). It was explained to him that we needed about 15 Greek addressees who could receive mail from East Berlin and East Germany. He was also told that this was in connection with the Berlin issue of 27 May. The Director was very receptive to our request and expressed every desire to assist us. He instructed his subordinates to collect the necessary data for us.

2. In April 1959 KYP turned over to us names and all available biographic data on 14 individuals who can be used by KUBARK as letter drops. In a number of cases in addition to the biographic data, they made available the information that exists on these individuals in their own files, the files of Athens General Security and some commercial references that were obtained from local banking institutions. KYP further stated that all individuals have been investigated and found to be trustworthy.

3. The problem of the frequency with which the recipients would receive letters presents no difficulty locally. In one instance KYP will allow the letters to reach the addressee who will turn them over to KYP. In all other cases KYP will arrange with the postal authorities to pick up the letters directly from the post office without the letters reaching the addressee.

4. We wish to emphasize that the 14 individuals provided by KYP are bilateral assets and should be considered as low security addressees.

5. As soon as we receive Headquarters approval to our request for POAs or amendments to OAs (see reference C), we will forward to you five medium to high security unilateral addresses as requested in reference A.

6. The information given to us by KYP on the 14 letter drops is forwarded herewith as attachments under separate cover.

7. It should be noted that in all cases there is a difference between the correct names or addresses as given on the addressee information sheet and the information given in #16 (Planner of addressing Envelope). In each case a slight change has been made which will be used by KYP as an indicator. The addressor should use the exact name and address as given in #16 but using the German words for "r." and "street" and for place names. In other words, if the entry in No. 16 were as follows:
