For secret writing purposes agent [] was supplied with water-soluble formula No. 40322 with which to manufacture S/W carbons. He also has water-soluble formula No. 10626 for the development of S/W messages from KUBARK. The S/W chemical and the developer are contained as medicinal capsules in separate jars. The supply is sufficient for over 100 separate secret writing and message development operations and each of the two kinds of capsules allows multiple-page writing or development. The agent was asked to demonstrate the writing and developing processes to his case officer upon his arrival in Cairo. We have only cited the writing and developing processes which the agent has, because description of the actual processes is somewhat detailed and complex. However, if you should require it, we can send detailed instructions for both systems on request. The agent showed himself to be proficient at both writing and developing after about an hour's training and, when questioned five days later, proved that he had the steps firmly memorized. If the agent requires refresher training in message development, we will pouch training message to you.</p> <p>2. METOPAZ has indicated that the methods for developing the agent's messages and for writing S/W messages keyed to the agent's developer are complex and require equipment which is believed not available to the Cairo Station. We therefore suggest that KUBARK messages which must be sent to SISTINE in S/W be pouched or cabled to this base for conversion and transmittal.</p> <p>3. We issued [] the Identity 1 accommodation address and instructed him to be sure to use the middle initial of the Identity 1 name when writing to the address. This initial is the servicing indicator. We also advised SISTINE to use his true name in countries where return addresses are required whenever he has reason to believe that he is under surveillance. Although the agent understood that use of a false return address might reveal his clandestine activity to an opposition service, he was leath to use his true name.</p> <p>4. While Reference A requested that we give [] more than one letter drop, we held off supplying him with the second and third accommodation addresses pending Headquarters-Cairo resolution of the issue raised in Reference B. Our brief contact with [] leads us to agree with your Reference C views on the agent's trustworthiness, but we have no Headquarters statement as to whether the agent is still suspect. If the agent is no longer suspect, we will pouch further accommodation addresses at your request.</p>
