| <p>1. The following is in reply to paragraph 2 of reference:</p> <p>a. CABATON 19 up to the present has never been used to receive mail. Until February 1959 Subject lived in one room in a farm house where all mail was placed on the hall table. Since this arrangement offered no possibilities as an accommodation address, and it was believed that a safehouse in Hannover might solve certain problems in the CADAISY project, we had Subject acquire an apartment for us.</p> <p>b. The first contemplated meeting with CADAISY in the safehouse was to take place on 27 June. [ ] had returned from three weeks leave on 25 June. Also on 25 June CABATON 19 had gone to Berlin and had not mailed the letter announcing his trip until too late for us to have notice. [ ] and [ ] went to the apartment an hour before the time for CADAISY to arrive, found CABATON 19 was not there, and encountered the landlord. Knowing CADAISY's route of approach to the apartment, [ ] and [ ] waited and watched for him. CADAISY was successfully intercepted by [ ] and therefore never approached the apartment.</p> <p>c. This experience with contingencies made it clear that the apartment was not suitable for the CADAISY operation. [ ] saw CABATON 19 on 9 July and told him that it was now clear that the apartment was not suitable. Present rent will be paid up at the end of August. After that date, CABATON 19 is on his own to find an apartment for himself.</p> <p>d. CABATON 19 has been reluctant from the beginning to receive mail from the DDR as long as his mother and two sisters are living in Havelberg. He is, however, willing to receive mail from other areas -- the Near, Middle, and Far East. The cover text of letters should indicate that the correspondent met CABATON 19 at the Hannover Fair. This is logical and his interest in agriculture and marketing should provide backstopping for this. Therefore, he will hereafter be used as a drop for mail from those areas.</p> <p>e. CABATON-19 now has a better job -- as a buyer for the largest grocery cooperative in Hannover.</p> <p>f. FROB 4844 requested a POA for the fiancee of CABATON-19. They are to be married on 8 August. This brings up an additional complication but it should not be insurmountable.</p> <p>g. The agent was reprimanded for not notifying us more in advance of his intent to be out of town. We hope and believe this is not indicative of further problems with him in the future.</p> <p>2. The following is in reply to paragraph 4 of reference:</p> <p>a. The Subject of FROB 4278 was recruited on 30 June by [ ] and [ ] and is now functioning as an accommodation address. We propose to designate him as CABATON-28. We will forward PRQ I and II and Memorandum of Oral Agreement as soon as possible.</p> <p>b. The Subject of FROB 3682 was spotted by [ ] There was no opportunity for [ ] to introduce another case officer to this man before his departure for Headquarters. However, it is our intent to attempt recruitment without benefit of introduction from [ ] the next time a member of this branch is in Limburg.</p> |  |                          |  |
