

- 1. CABATON-69 (see separate cover attachment A) and CABATON-70 (see separate cover attachment B) are offered to BOB for operational assignment. They are both close personal friends of DIVOT-8 who have agreed to receive mail from the Soviet Zone for her. They believe they are doing this as a personal favor to DIVOT-8 who, as a refugee, cannot receive mail direct, and are completely unwitting of ODYOKE involvement. In keeping with DIVOT-8's cover story vis-a-vis CABATONS-69 and -70, we cannot test these letter drops through mailings from the West. We suggest, therefore, that BOB instruct the agents to whom these addresses are assigned to send at least two test letters before using the channels to transmit operational information.
- 2. We also request that BOB instruct their agents to write the open text of their letters in such a manner as to substantiate the cover story DIVOT-8 has arranged with CABATONs-69 and -70, i.e., the letters are personal mail for DIVOT-8. More specifically, it is requested that the open text be addressed in DIVOT-8's true first name and that remarks in the open text be consistent with DIVOT-8's true personal background (see FROB 1226). This is essential since it is obviously conceivable that either CABATON-69 or -70 could open an operational letter in error and we would not want them to become suspicious as the result of indiscretions contained in the open text.
- 3. You will note that the indicator to be used with CABATONS-69 and -70 to identify operational mail is the middle initial (see separate cover attachments A and B) which is the initial of DIVOT-8's true first name. We believe this will satisfactorily explain the difference in the first name of the addressee as it appears on the envelope and in the open text of the letter should the Soviet Zone postal authorities open any of the letters.
- 4. When operational mail is received by either CABATON-60 or -70, they will telephone DIVOT-8 who will pick it up and deliver it personally to her FOB case officer. We will then, in accordance with current procedure, forward the mail via APO facilities to BOB.
- 5. Please advise us promptly when Subjects are assigned operationally so that we can alert them via DIVOT-8 when they can expect to start receiving mail.
