1. Introduction

The SPENNER apparatus mission will include retardation of a possible Soviet military advance to the west, but the apparatus will not carry out such retardation to a degree that would result in the destruction of the nuclei which it is anticipated will be preserved during the initial hot war phases for later expansion into fully developed stay-behind units.

4. Communications

This net's primary mission will be recruitment and training of stay-behind radio operators and the assignment of such operators to the operational units of the parasilitary groups.

(1) The agent will devote full time to development of the net. He will take advantage of the facilities, time, and personnel of the Soviet TRAMER organization, and will be in touch with TRAMER's present activities. The head of the agent will assign a staff capable of organizing TRAMER assets into the net's organization. leaflets, pamphlets, letters of indictment, and other propaganda material has increased proportionately. The steady growth in activity compelled TRENNER both to move its headquarters to larger offices and to hire ten additional interviewers, secretaries, and employees engaged in the project's filing and screening activities.

By June, 1951, TRENNER has conducted in Eastern Germany an extensive enlightenment campaign of lectures and debates in universities, juridical, industrial, and trade union groups. This campaign has proved an effective one. Lectures have been held as a regular feature, which is supported, organized, but not financed by organizations such as the Institute for Democracy (West German Chamber of Commerce) and the Justice Ministries of the various Länder. Expenses for this campaign average in \$3,000 per month. This aspect of TRENNER activities has been particularly effective in combating Soviet propaganda before a wide and influential segment of the West German population. This, in turn, has been instrumental in counteracting Communist propaganda campaigns and the growing spirit of nationalism in the Federal Republic.

6. The cost of all propaganda production and distribution activities has increased very considerably. Since TPEMBER has built up an effective clearance system of its own under which prospective members are checked through local facilities not available to QKOCIGAR agencies, TPEMBER will have primary responsibility for the security of the apparatus. Where applicable, DYULAVIER will support TPEMBER by checking those files available to QKOCIGAR agencies. DYULAVIER will reserve the right to reject any individual found unacceptable to TPEMBER.

4) Evaluation of Risk

Over the past operational experience with TPEMBER indicates that the risk of exposure of QKOCIGAR interest in the undertaking in no manner precludes the implementation of the preliminary aspect of this vital project.

5. TPEMBER is Subject for Established Activities

There will be no change in TPEMBER's own control, or security arrangements, from those described in the original project plan (Attachment 1). In addition operational security will be maintained. ANNEX A

SUMMARY OF YPESMER ACTIVITIES

YPESMER is a legally registered organization, with an overt office in West Berlin which is visited daily by many West Zone Germans. The principal activity of YPESMER is to direct an intelligence net of about 1,000 persons scattered throughout the West Zone of Germany, which furnishes information for intelligence and reports on the activities and arrangements of YPESMER's personnel. This net is essentially and securely compartmentalized. The organization has a strong ideological motivation. The following activities have been reported to have been as follows:

1. An information letter of 10,000 copies is published approximately semi-monthly, summarizing the status of the Soviet Zone.
2. A series of pamphlets, denigrating the Soviet administration and including information and data available for collateral work, is published in Berlin at rates of from 5,000 to 15,000 copies.
3. Working lists of persons so indicated are distributed in Berlin and West Germany.
4. A monthly report, compiled from the Zone of Information, is distributed to the West Government, Radio stations, wire services, and other outlets.
5. An all-Germany campaign of lectures before university, industrial, and trade union groups in Western Germany reveals unjust practices in the East Zone.
6. Pamphlets and leaflets are produced exposing Soviet Zone economic practices and policies, with reports on the East Zone economic situation.
7. Information is collected on ostensible political refugees who enter the Western Zone of Germany with SED assignments.
8. A "white list" is prepared of personalities who, despite their official functions in the Soviet Zone, aid in one way or another in resisting the Soviet Zone regime.

TEMPER's activities have received wide publicity in the West German and Western press, and have provoked violent reactions from the official Soviet Zone press. As a result of this activity, uncertainty and insecurity have become evident even among the highest police officials in the Soviet Zone.

Action is now pending on a proposal that, in accordance with the terms of the Berlin Agreement of April 1948, to establish a system of inspection. The purpose of such a system would be to help the most disadvantaged people, from both the West and the countries under Soviet domination, for a realistic and fair policy of reconstruction of Communist's policies and of inspection as a principle of government.

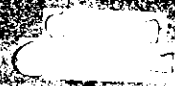
