- a. Action Reported by Field: None
- d. Security Factors:

(1) The Chief of Berlin Operations Base has advised the Chief of Mission, Frankfurt that the behavior and attitude of a former CADROWN staffer (CATIPPET) may have security implications for KUBARK's present and future activities. Instances cited of CATIPPET's behavior and attitude follow:

(a) He has written a number of letters in a fruitless attempt to secure some reimbursement for damage suffered by his furniture during transportation from Berlin to Frankfurt. Resettlement in the West was a part of the termination procedure in the case of CATIPPET.

(b) Intercepts of letters by CATIPPET to a friend indicate that: He has been unable to secure regular employment. He is disillusioned with [] (former P/A of CADROWN) regarding his motivation and behavior.

He has apparently discussed internal CADROWN matters with unknown persons presumably in influential positions in Bonn, and intimates that he may well engage in such discussions in future.

He has apparently furnished his West German address to a number of CADROWN refugees who are in contact with him and has compared unfavorably the treatment he and they are now receiving with certain other former CADROWN members.

(2) Chief of Berlin Operations Base feels that CATIPPET's increasingly bitter attitude is definitely enhancing the possibilities that he may take action prejudicial to KUBARK's interests. He therefore recommends to the Chief of Mission:

- (a) That contact be re-established with CATIPPET by HARVARD.
- (b) That a fair reimbursement be made to CATIPPET for damage to his furniture.
- (c) That support equivalent to CATIPPET's former salary be given him until employment can be obtained for him.

(3) Headquarters has concurred in the proposals made by the Chief of Berlin Operations Base. We have not yet been advised of Frankfurt's response to these proposals.
