

CADROIT CONTACT REPORT

10 July 1956

Date, Time, and Place of Meeting: 5 July 1956, 1400-1500, pre-arranged cafe.

Present: a. CARBOHYDRATE b. []

This was a normal meeting with CARBOHYDRATE. Following points were covered:

1. The upcoming WUSTRACK/CARBO meeting on 11 July. The SIS had promised at the previous meeting to release FUELLBORN jun. by 5 July. If he is actually released, the question arises what info CARBO should then give, if any, to continue the play (his present standpoint is no more info until FUELLBORN is released per SIS promise). Agreed that CARBO should give no more info if F is not released prior to the meeting with WUSTRACK. If he is released, then CARBO would pass info on the CADROIT handling of the SIS approaches to PESCH and Kurt WOLFF; he would say that Kurt W. had received a letter from SIS noting PESCH had earlier been approached by SIS and requesting Kurt W. to cooperate with SIS to secure release of "BOHE". This had caused considerable difficulty for PESCH, who had been the subject of a security investigation. (Note this ~~man~~ corroborates the last letter which PESCH sent the MFS refusing further cooperation.) CARBO not to pass this info, however, without prior check with [] if FUELLBORN jun. is really released. (Nothing has been heard of a release of F. jun. since then, so the problem became academic.)
2. [] briefed CARBO on the LUEHE case (a contact of FUMATE's who has been denied a G-Schein and wants to appeal the case). Arranged that L. will visit CADROIT and ask for CARBO, who will do all possible to secure the G-Schein.
3. Killed the tentative idea of recruiting leg man to patrol CADROIT premises and test its security. No action had been taken, per previous instructions.
4. CARBO delivered:
 - a. Copy of his attachment to June monthly, including security analysis.
 - b. Copies of individual arrest reports (Nos. 170 to 212). These items have all been covered in previous monthly reports, but a separate

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detailed report on each is required. (CARBO is catching up on his homework before going on vacation.)

c. Copies of report written by G OLBRIKH on latest visit to him by his DDR residing brother at SFS behest. The brother had been visited again on 18 June and 25 June by the two SFS officers who had earlier approached him (personal descriptions are included in the attached report). They disregarded the brother's attempts to claim that OLBRIKH was not employed with CADROIT and urged him to increase the contact with OLBRIKH. The brother was to carry bona fides to OLBRIKH that he would receive a good position if he would return to the DDR, etc. At the second meeting, a third SFS officer instructed the brother to offer G OLBRIKH DM 10,000 if he would remain in place within CADROIT and give information to the SFS. The brother received the Potsdam te. No. 9921 App. 228 or 225 with which he could contact the appropriate SFS officers (Note it is Potsdam, not East Berlin). It was agreed between OLBRIKH and his brother that the latter would report complete failure to the SFS—OLBRIKH had supposedly threatened to have the brother arrested if he visited him again. NOTE: This substantial offer of money is something new. The SFS has not ordinarily offered money of this sort in its past attempts to recruit CADROIT staffers. (To be reported separately.) CARBO noted that OLBRIKH had not invited him to take part in the meeting with the brother, because the latter is very nervous, is definitely against having "outsiders" drawn into the matter. CARBO assured [] the reluctance stemmed from the brother, not OLBRIKH himself. [] noted this was not quite in accord with CADROIT SOP, If it were not possible for CARBO to ^{from OLBRIKH} debrief the brother himself, he should get a report/as detailed as one he would write himself (personal descriptions, etc.). In addition,

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in the future again. CARBO will do (although, as noted, he is going on a four week vacation). [] noted he had discussed earlier the same day with LADELL ~~the~~ why CARBO had not met the brother for direct debriefing and what could be done to insure that the debriefing was as direct as possible. CARBO might hear some advice from LADELL re the matter, etc.

5. Since CARBO is going on vacation, did not discuss with him an idea discussed earlier the same day with LADELL which would mean considerable work for CARBO, [] etg al. The idea was that a statistical analysis would be run of all arrests in the last year to determine how many arrestees had been carrying out certain functions (normally active MA, PZ Man, PZ Man who also serves as normal MA, PZ Man who carries not only propaganda letters but ~~personal~~ personal messages and warnings as well, PZ Man who functions as surveiller from time to time, normal MA who not only ~~visits~~ visits the office but writes reports with cover name on occasion, etc.) If the numbers involved are large enough (which they will probably not be in all cases), we might get a better ~~idea~~ idea of the risks involved in various functions. Any categories which appear to suffer from abnormally high number of arrests might be scrutinized for possible security weaknesses (for example, if it appears that the rate of arrests among ~~normal~~ MA who write reports through the mail under cover addresses is considerably higher than among normally active MA who do not write, we might look into the possibilities of an SIS penetration of the Post, with whose cooperation the clandestine mailing is carried out.). LADELL had thought well of the idea, but no concrete action had been proposed at the time due to upcoming vacations for personnel concerned. Although LADELL had played down the amount of work which ~~and~~ appeared ready to go ahead with it now, would be involved, believe that it would prove considerable if the job is done with the necessary statistical thoroughness. This idea thus takes a lower ~~priority~~ than other tasks for the time being. []
