1. CATOPHAT supports the acquisition of access agents for use against Soviet Embassy and Trade Mission Personnel in Germany. This action requests renewal for FY 1970 in the amount of IneFY 1969 was authorized. The sizable reduction was occasioned by the dropping of a number of agents who proved non-productive.

- 2. At present CATOPHAT funds four support agents: a husband and wife safehouse team, the German chaufeur provided by certain German companies for the use of Soviet Trade Mission Officials and a Hungarian journalist who provides biographic and assessment data on Soviet officials. Salaries for this group make up more than half the total authorization sought. The balance is for developing new contact assets. In effect this project provides developmental funds outside those authorized by
- 3. To date accomplishments under this project have not been impressive. Nevertheless, if the Station is to conduct effective operations against the Soviet target, it must develop access agents. The present renewal action indicates that the operations covered will be more critically scrutinized and controlled. The FI Staff recommends approval.

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PROJECT CATOPRAT RENEVAL

I. IDENTITY

1. CATOPRAT is the cryptonym assigned to the MHRARSH Embassy located near Bonn, West Germany. CAPATOFF is the Cryptonym assigned to the MHHARSH Trade Mission located in Cologne, West Germany. Project CATOPRAT is an operation directed against CATOPHAT, CAPATOFF and the personnel assigned to both installations. Of the 89 persons officially assigned to CATOPHAT, 37 are known or suspect members of MHHARSH intelligence. Of the 73 persons officially assigned to CAPATOFF, 21 are known or suspect members of MHHARSH intelligence.

III. PURPOSE

- 2. To acquire positive intelligence information on MHHARSH military research, military and political plans and MHHARSH intelligence activity through the recruitment or defection of personnel assigned to CATGPHAT and CAPAYGFF, with primary emphasis on those members of the MHARSH intelligence services who are most likely to have access to such information. (Priority A-1 of the current Operating Directive).
- 3. To acquire counter-intelligence information relative to MEHARSH clandestine activity conducted by CATOPHAT and CAPATORY personnel, especially that which is directed against VOLADY interests.

IV. DESCRIPTION

- 4. CATOPHAT is designed to develop a stable of controlled assets who can provide assessment and vulnerability data on the Station's MHHARSH targets. Current assets are as follows:
 - A. CATOPEAT 1 & 2 A husband-and-wife team which acts as LP keepers for an audio operation directed against a primary Station target.
 - B. CATOPHAT 16 A 30-year old German national who is employed by several German companies as a chauffeur for two CAPATOFF officials. He reports on the itinerary of these officials and on their activities and contacts while visiting German firms.
 - C. HIDROWE A 56-year old Hungarian journalist who provides assessment and biographic data on CATOPHAT officials.

V. CHANGES

5. During Spring 1968, the MEHARSH branch
This has resulted in a closer and more natural association of MEHARSH branch officers with the local diplomatic and Gorman communities, the principal milieu in which CATOPHAT personnel operate.

- A. In Hovember 1968 the CALLIKAK monitoring responsibility for the CATOPHAT and CAPATOFF installations was taken over by MHRRUSH authorities. Although this resulted in a temperary histus in this important coverage, the flow of operational information from this source has resumed. The raw ARROSEY material (CALLIKAK on CATOPHAT and specified CATOPHAT personal residences) is currently passed to the AESCREEN team, with the transcribed results and used tapes being returned to CAVHISPER. Only recently has the CAPAYOFF CALLIKAK coverage (under the control of CATUSK) resumed and in this case, only the finished CATUSK reports are passed to RYROCK.
- B. In Fall 1968 the major operational effort of the MHHARSH branch was directed against two members of CATOPHAT, who were the ARRICK and ARGRIP residents, respectively. As a by-product, this effort has led to a revised method of handling leads provided by CALLIKAK and CAPRAIRIE, which in turn has resulted in an earlier identification of CATOPHAT/CAPAYOFF contacts.
- C. Buring mid-Winter 1968 Soviet began a search for controllable access agents among
 varied groups of people, who although perhaps presently
 no in contact with members of CATCPHAT/CAPAYOFF, could
 be placed in positions in the local diplomatic and German
 communities where they would have an opportunity of
 establishing meaningful access. Our chief criterion
 in selecting such people is that they have the necessary
 attributes needed for good access agents. It is hoped
 by this method to broaden the scope of our attack on
 the local Soviet target.

VI. ACCOMPLISHMENT

6. This Project is not designed to produce intelligence although HTDROME was the source of several disseminators during the past year. His production was reviewed in the CABERO Project

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- 7. The major product of this Project has been and probably will continue to be operational and counter-intelligence information concerning the persons and activities of the CATOPHAT and CAPATOFF installations. This type of information has increased our operational intelligence holdings on both the CATOPHAT and CAPATOFF targets and has allowed one successful PHG action in limiton with CAVHISPER. We do not expect any significant increase in meaningful, hard intelligence reporting, in keeping with the above stated Paragraph ? purpose of this Project, until an HHARSH intelligence officer has been recruited and is fully cooperative.
- 5. During the past Project year CATOPHAT assets have provided biographic and assessment data on members of CATOPHAT and CAPATOFF with whom they have had contact, one known ARGRIP officer was PRO'd, and the number of intelligence disseminations increased slightly. Three of our CATOPHAT agent assets can be considered as genuine access agents to the CATOPHAT/CAPATOFF targets. Because of the successful PMG action, one of the three has since been terminated. The concentrated effort against two specific targets (mentioned in paragraph 5-B, above) has developed a number of leads, who may be turned into true access agents and thereby increase the effectiveness of the Project in the gathering of operational intelligence. As noted above, we are now engaged in a concentrated effort to build up a stable of controlled agents whom we can commit as circumstances require against targets of our choice.

VII. PROBLEMS

- 9. As in all areas of the world, MMERUSE being no exception, there are certain general problems related to operating against the MMEARSH target, none of them insurmountable. They are mentioned here as a matter of record.
 - A. Non-communist contacts by CATOPHAT/CAPATOFF members are either pursued in keeping with the official functions of the individual member's overt position, or if for some other purpose, have the sanction of that member's superior. In search for access agents, this MEHARSH tactic generally serves to limit the types of persons from which RVROCK can pick and chose, but fortunately

CATOPHAT/CAPATOFF maintain such a large group of contacts, that lack of numbers as such poses so problem. Those CATOPHAT/CAPATOFF contacts who in general are not eager to assist RYROCK fall into the following groups: Susinessmes having dealings with the Communist Bloc and persons of an ideological stripe, who if not accessarily pro-communist are certainly not willing to stick their seck out for the West. Fortunately there are many contacts who do not fall into either one group or the other, and there are exceptions to the rule even within these groups.

- B. The second problem area relates to ascertaining which of the many CATOPRAT/CAPAYOFF contacts are likely to be willing to offer us their services if properly approached. CALLIKAE provides the vast majority of leads to all the overt CATOPHAT/CAPAYOFF contacts, but it does no more than that. The greatest problem is to acquire the secondary assessment data on each of these contacts in order to determine which of them is likely to be cooperative. For those who are members of the diplomatic community or resident in the local ERECTER or third mational communities, this is usually so great problem. For the many outside the eforementioned communities, it is more difficult and time-consuming to gain access to them and the number and types of approaches possible are considerably more limited. One additional problem concerning the acquisition of agents for use against CATOPRAT/ CAPAYOFF is the small geographic and population sphere in which the target and its contacts move. This factor dictates that great care and caution be used in assessing and developing agent candidates for use against the tergot. lest RVROCK's efforts come to the attention of the MHEARSHORS before the agent candidate is fully recruited and a claudestime relationship has been established.
- 10. The foregoing problems do present obstacles in the way of achieving the objectives of this Project, but the possibilities for acquiring significant intelligence through the successful recruitment of select MRHARSH IS officers assigned to CATOPHAT or CAPATORY makes the effort to overcome such obstacles more than worthwhile.

13. There is no inter-agency coordination required for this Project.

IX. PLANS

it is necessary to concentrate limited RVROCK
manpower on select, primary targets, who are known or suspect
intelligence officers and who, if recruited, offer the best
chances of fulfilling the paragraph 2 purpose of this Project.
Concentrated effort will be directed against other members of
CATOPHAT/CAPATOYY (including mon-IS) only when there are indications of vulnerability, which can be parlayed into recruitment. Although these personnel are not likely to provide
significant hard intelligence responsive to the paragraph. 2
purpose of this Project, they would be valuable assets for
operational and counter-intelligence (paragraph 3 purpose) on
the CATOPHAT/CAPATOYY target and vulnerability and assessment
dats on primary target EHHARSH intelligence officers.

- 15. In order to acquire the vulnerability and assessment data necessary for determining which of the primary target MRHARGE intelligence officers offer the best recruitment or defection prospects, [is making a major effort to expand its stable of access agents capable of assessing and developing MERARSH intelligence officers. In an effort to increase the total number of persons available in this category, greater attention is being given to that group of people already in the diplomatic and local German communities, who although they do not presently have contact with members of CATOPRAT/CAPATOFF, could be sut into such contact. An increased effort is being made to locate persons having no pregent contact with the CATOPHAT/CAPAYOFF target or any reason to have contact, but because of intelligence and personal qualifications are good access agent untertal. It is planned to train them and place them in the local diplomatic and German communities where they will have an opportunity to gain accors to members of CATOPHAT/CAPATOFF. (see paragraph 5-C, above). approach will also allow the placement of fully recruited agents in MHRUMI companies doing business with MHRARSH and having contact with members of CATOPHAT/CAPAYOFF. This will obviate one of the major obstacles in gaining access to target personnel mentioned in paragraph 9-A, above.
- official communities are not first priority recruitment targets, close scrutiny is being given those select few who have
 continuous and close contact with primary target MHEARER
 intelligence officers assigned to CATOPHAT and CAPATOFF. It
 is recognized that considerable time and effort is required to
 effect the recruitment of a Bloc person and only those persons
 will be considered who not only already have the desired access
 but have previously shown themselves to have vulnerabilities
 which would make them good recruitment prospects.
