

Questions for Walter Pforzheimer: Followups to First Interview,
November 17, 1982

1. You speak highly of John Blandford, on the House Armed Services Committee staff. Can you tell me more about him and how he helped you in your dealings on the Hill?
Ditto re Bob Smart.
Ditto re John Adams, Senate Armed Services Committee. - *still in town, WLP believes*
2. P. 37: re your recommendation that no one but the DCI testify before Congress. Can you expand on this? I know, for instance, that you yourself testified from time to time.
3. Near the bottom of p. 38, you have an unclear reference to "Mr. Casey's legislative problem." Can you explain?
4. On p. 42, you stated that your role did not include getting into substantive discussions with congressmen. How would you define the role of legislative counsel?
5. P. 45: you allude to collaboration between John Adams and yourself in writing the report for the Senate Armed Services Committee in connection with the National Security Act. Can you amplify?
6. Inaudible words on pp. 61 and 68.
7. You spoke at a couple of points about friction or "jealousy" between you and Larry Houston once you moved into OGC (pp. 27, 95-96). Did this have any bearing on your work on Capitol Hill?
8. You suggest that I remind you to tell me about Senator O'Mahoney ordering CIA to get out of the State Department's budget.
9. You say that we'll want to discuss Senator Thurston Morton at some point.
