MONDAY. Paul Taylor once staged a dance in which two figures stood absolutely motionless, and another that incorporated a live dog in the action. Though the works presented by the Taylor troupe on tonight's *Great Performances* (8 P.M. PBS) aren't quite that quirky, they do exhibit the choreographer's characteristic wit (in the whimsical "3 Epitaphs") and vitality (amply displayed in "Aureole") . . . According to a provocative *World* documentary, international arms dealer Frank Torpil "put steel in the spine of Idi Amin" and also sold guns and bugging equipment to the likes of Libya's Muammar Kaddafi and the late Nicaraguan strongman Anastasio Somoza. Tonight's report (9 P.M. PBS) looks at the life—and the shadowy world—of this former CIA agent, who says he's "neutral and commercial."

A FORMER C-I-A AGENT APPEARED ON A BRITISH TELEVISION DOCUMENTARY TUESDAY NIGHT, CALMLY DISCUSSING HOW HE SOLD GUNS, EXPLOSIVES AND POISONS TO CLIENTS -- INCLUDING LIBYA'S MOAMMAR KHADAFY (MOO-AH'-MAHR KAH-DAH'-FEE). FRANK TERPIL, A FUGITIVE IN THIS COUNTRY, WAS ASKED BY AN INTERVIEWER IF HE WAS BOTHERED BY THE POLITICS OF HIS CLIENTS -- WHO ALSO INCLUDED IDI AMIN AND THE LATE SHAH OF IRAN. TERPIL SMILED AND SAID: "I REGARD MYSELF AS NEUTRAL AND COMMERCIAL." TERPIL DISAPPEARED LAST NOVEMBER. THE DOCUMENTARY'S DIRECTOR SAYS HE MAY HAVE BEEN KIDNAPPED BY SYRIAN SECURITY FORCES.
