



Welcome to the 1979 Annual Meeting of the American Bar Association and to our great host city of Dallas.

The Annual Meeting is the major educational and social event of the Association year. This year's meeting has special significance, since it commemorates the first year of our second century.

More than one hundred major programs have been developed by ABA sections, divisions and committees to address the issues which we will face during our second century. Included are several "showcase programs," one of which will provide a status report on the work of the Commission on the Evaluation of Professional Standards. This program is co-sponsored by the National Conference of Bar Presidents and will be held at the Hyatt Regency. The 1979 Annual Meeting marks the tenth anniversary of the adoption of our model Code of Professional Responsibility. At this meeting, the Commission will make its first presentation of some of the tentative findings and conclusions of its comprehensive review of the model Code. This meeting will also be the Commission's first opportunity to solicit comments from Association members on the issues it is examining.

Other "showcase programs" will be held at the Dallas Convention Center which is the focal point for this year's meeting. Subjects which will be covered are:

- Cameras in the courtroom. Working in cooperation with several national media organizations, the Association is sponsoring a program designed to explore the advantages and disadvantages of photographic and electronic media coverage of courtroom proceedings. The program will include an appellate argument on cameras in the courtroom, a demonstration of the actual effect of cameras in appellate and trial-level proceedings, an exhibit of media equipment that would be used in the courtroom, and a film summary of the history of camera coverage of judicial proceedings.
- Attorney-client relationships. The General Practice Section is sponsoring a program entitled, "Our Clients . . . Love Them or They'll Leave You." This program is designed to train participants in non-trial, non-adversarial professional skills.
- The use of legal assistants. This program is co-sponsored by the Economics of Law Practice Section and the Standing Committee on Legal Assistants. In connection with this program, we plan to premiere a video-tape on law office practice techniques developed by the Task Force on

New Methods for Improving the Quality of Lawyers' Services to Clients. The videotape will discuss such subjects as the efficient use of professional and non-professional personnel and the use of modern office equipment and systems to cut law office costs.

- Terrorism and violence as means of legal and social change, a program sponsored by the Young Lawyers Division.
- "Whistle Blowers in the Federal Government," a program of the Administrative Law Section on government employees who reveal agency abuses.
- A review of the effects of Watergate reforms. This program is sponsored by the Criminal Justice Section.
- The all-volunteer armed services, a program conducted by the Standing Committee on Lawyers in the Armed Forces and the Standing Committee on Legal Assistance for Military Personnel.
- Trade relations with the Peoples Republic of China, a program of the International Law Section.
- "Deregulation? The Wave of the Future?" a program sponsored by the Standing Committee on Aeronautical Law.
- Space commerce and the space shuttle. This program will be conducted by the Science and Technology Section.
- "Drafting Legal Documents in Plain Language," sponsored by the Standing Committee on Legal Drafting and the Law Student Division.
- Lawyer retirement, a program of the Standing Committee on Retirement of Lawyers.

To complement this outstanding educational program, we will have, I am told, the best special events and entertainment program ever held at an ABA Annual Meeting. You and your families will be able to participate in such enjoyable programs as:

- A special welcoming reception on Sunday afternoon, August 12.
- A luncheon with Edith Head, in which she will show her awardwinning movie costumes.
- A ranch party, including a barbecue dinner, a country-western band and a quarter horse show.
- The Fiesta de la Villa Grande, where cocktails and a buffet will be served at a magnificent Spanish-style estate.
- The President's Reception, which will be held in the beautiful Great Hall of the Apparel Mart. Each registrant will be an honored guest at this reception, which will be Tuesday night, August 14.

As you can tell, we have planned one of the greatest Annual Meetings in our history. We could not have done so, however, without the fine work of the Local Advisory Committee, which is chaired by Charles P. Storey and composed of Jerry L. Buchmeyer; T. Lamar Caudle III; David F. Chappell; John W. Clark, Jr.; Marshall J. Doke, Jr.; Morris Harrell; Travis D. Shelton; Cullen Smith; Robert H. Thomas; and Louis J. Weber, Jr. Also crucial to the planning of the meeting has been the leadership of Mrs. Robert B. (Dorothy) Cousins, who has coordinated the special events and entertainment program.

As always, the Association staff has provided invaluable assistance to these local advisers and to many more members of the Association who have helped plan this meeting. Our objective has been to make this Annual Meeting informative and enjoyable. I hope you will find it so.

I hope you enjoy your stay.



COMMENTARY

The Standing Committee on Retirement of Lawyers has spent several years studying this subject matter from the standpoint of the law firm, the lawyer approaching retirement, and the retired lawyer. The program will examine the law firm's approach—the transition of lawyers from active to retired status; pre-retirement cut-back in earnings; flexible versus mandatory retirement policies; the importance in general of adequate death, disability, and retirement provisions in law firms; the use of older lawyers in the firm's practice; and the malpractice problem. Similarly, an analysis will be presented of typical retirement provisions made by large firms and by small firms; funded vs. unfunded plans; and the use of the H.R. 10 plan fund. The program will then examine, from the individual lawyer's standpoint, his or her financial considerations (adequate retirement income from social security benefits, private savings including life insurance, retirement provisions by the law firm); the use of H.R. 10 (Keogh) Plans, Individual Retirement Accounts, and Professional Corporations; tax considerations in retirement planning and other tax and estate planning; early retirement and the development of new opportunities; and commitments upon retirement not to practice in competition with the firm. The program will conclude with a discussion of activities and opportunities after retirement. These include income producing activity on a part time basis, such as service to the lawyer's former law firm; opportunities in teaching; consulting services to others; and the value of a complete re-orientation in work and new challenges. Attention will be given to public service opportunities, such as public interest law firm programs, legal aid, service to the legal profession, and government-sponsored small business counseling programs. Finally, the program will consider enjoying the good life, including hobbies, travel, good health, longevity, and various other sources of personal interest and activity.

Can and should anything be done about the complex way lawyers draft even simple legal documents? New York State now requires consumer documents to be written in plain English.

Over 30 states are considering following New York's lead. Should the American Bar Association support such legislation? This and related issues will be debated by the following experts on the subject of legal drafting:

James B. Minor, Former Chairman of the Standing Committee on Legal Drafting. Mr. Minor has headed up many legislation and regulations drafting projects and has taught legal drafting to hundreds of lawyers.

Rose Anne Lawson is an attorney with the Office of Federal Register which annually publishes thousands of pages of regulations. Ms. Lawson has instructed hundreds of federal employees in classes designed to improve drafting skills.

William G. Schiffbauer, National Student Program Director, Legislative Research and Drafting, Law Student Division. Mr. Schiffbauer headed up a drafting project at Creighton Law School to improve the drafting skills of students at that school and to develop techniques that would be applicable in other law schools.

Richard P. McManus, Vice President, Director—Law Department, Consumer Finance Division, Household Finance Corporation, Prospect Heights, Illinois. Mr. McManus has been interested in plain English and has participated in drafting documents for approximately 13 years. He has been instrumental in preparing loan and insurance documents for Household Finance Corporation for their offices throughout the United States.

Wilbur H. Friedman is Chairman of the Special Committee on Consumer Agreements of the New York County Lawyers Association, which committee has issued several reports with respect to plain English law. He has written six articles in the New York Times and the New York Law Journal and has appeared on radio and TV. Mr. Friedman is a member of the House of Delegates of the American Bar Association and Former President of the New York County Lawyers Association. Frederic M. Carlin, is presently in New York City. Beginning at 2:00 p.m. in the Dallas County Courthouse, there will be a four-part program designed to give members of the bar an opportunity to explore the advantages and disadvantages of camera coverage of judicial proceedings. In the main jury room, a mythical state supreme court will hear a petition to remove the state's prohibition on cameras in the courtroom. In one courtroom, there will be camera coverage of a mock criminal trial. In two other courtrooms, there will be demonstrations of media equipment that is used to cover judicial proceedings. In a final courtroom, there will be films and oral presentations depicting the developmental history of the use of cameras in American courtrooms.

COMMENTARY

At its February 1979 meeting, the American Bar Association House of Delegates considered a proposal to revise the ABA Code of Judicial Conduct and the ABA Criminal Justice Standards to permit the limited use of electronic and photographic media equipment in the courtroom. After lengthy debate, the proposal was defeated by a divided vote.

The subject of cameras in the courtroom continues to be of considerable concern to the legal profession and to the public generally. Approximately half of all states have adopted either permanent or experimental rules permitting some form of television, radio and photographic coverage of judicial proceedings. The purpose of this program is to explore the advantages and disadvantages of the use of electronic and photographic media equipment in the courtroom. With the cooperation and assistance of television station WFAA in Dallas and several national media organizations (including the American Newspaper Publishers Association, the American Society of Newspaper Editors, the National Press Photographers Association, and the Radio-Television News Directors Association), the audience will have a chance both to witness a debate on cameras in the courtroom and to observe the actual effects of camera coverage of mock judicial proceedings.

1. The Supreme Court Hearing

The program will be divided into four segments:

Beginning at 2:00 p.m. in the Jury Room of the Dallas County Courthouse, there will be a mock Supreme Court argument.

Four positions will be presented to the Court: (1) that the existing rule prohibiting camera coverage of judicial proceedings should be maintained; (2) that if cameras are to be allowed, they should be permitted only at the appellate level; (3) that cameras should be permitted, but that parties and witnesses should have the right to limit or exclude their use; and (4) that cameras should be permitted regardless of the preferences of the participants, so long as the right to a fair trial is preserved. There will be both electronic and still camera coverage of the appellate argument, providing a permanent record of the proceedings and giving the audience an opportunity to observe the actual effects of camera coverage of an appellate hearing.

Robert F. Hanley, Chicago, Illinois, former Chairman of the Litigation Section, will argue that, if cameras are to be allowed, they should be permitted only in appellate proceedings.

Lee Loevinger, Washington, D.C., former Commissioner of the Federal Communications Commission, will argue that cameras should be allowed, but that parties, witnesses, attorneys and other trial participants should be authorized to limit their usage.

Whitney North Seymour, New York, New York, Past President of the American Bar Association, will argue that existing prohibitions on camera coverage should be maintained and that the petition should be denied.

2. The Mock Criminal Trial

In Courtroom 599, beginning at 2:45, there will be a mock criminal trial. Electronic equipment will record this trial, subject to the same rules that will govern camera coverage of the appellate argument. The mock trial will include opening statements, the examination of witnesses, cross-examinations, and closing statements. In Courtroom 5137, television monitors will show the mock trial on closed circuit, giving the audience a chance to move from one courtroom to the other, comparing their live observations with the view seen through the eye of the television camera.

3. A Demonstration of Electronic Equipment Used in the Coverage of Judicial Proceedings

In Courtroom 499, beginning at 2:15, there will be an exhibition of media equipment that is used in the courtroom. Members of the audience will be given an opportunity to explore the technical issues involved in electronic media coverage: to ask questions; to observe the use of silent-shutter cameras; to see themselves on television; etc.

In Courtroom 565, beginning at 2:45, there will be a demonstration of the electronic equipment that is not used in the courtroom, but that is used to support and disseminate courtroom coverage. This "media pooling room" will be functional, servicing the needs of representatives of the local and national press who are in attendance.

4. Films Depicting the Developmental History of the Use of Cameras in the Courtroom

In Courtroom 4137, beginning at 2:30, there will be a series of short films and oral presentations depicting the use of cameras in the courtroom. This segment of the program will include actual footage of trials that have been televised.

Establishing and Recognizing the Need for Legal Assistants

the House of Delegates, developed by the Commission in its report FEDERAL REGULATION: ROADS TO REFORM. The recommendations address the significant problem of a multiplicity of independent specialized federal agencies, and the absence of any mechanism for coordinating and conforming them to balancing judgments of elected generalists who can be held politically accountable. Should the President have a limited power to accelerate and modify agency decisions concerning issues of national importance where conflicts exist between statutory goals? As recommended, such a power would be subject to procedural constraints and congressional and judicial review. The Association is joining the Sections of International Law and Public Contract Law to sponsor this most timely program. The program draws upon the experience of two bar association delegations to the Peoples Republic of China during the past year, as well as the personal and professional contact which the speakers and panelists have had with China before and after normalization of relations between the United States and the PRC.

The program features three panels on the following topics:

Legal Developments in the Peoples Republic of China—An Overview

Stanley B. Lubman, a San Francisco attorney, and Professor R. Randle Edwards of Columbia University School of Law, will discuss the promulgation of new legal codes and the establishment of an association of lawyers in Peking. Mr. Lubman is currently Vice-Chairman of the Committee on the Peoples Republic of China of the Section of International Law, and both Mr. Lubman and Professor Edwards have made numerous trips to the PRC during the past year and have written extensively on this subject. Changing Legal Relations between the United States and Taiwan The implementation and administration of the Taiwan Relations Act will be covered by Professor Victor H. Li of Stanford Law School and Stephen Orlins, Deputy Assistant Legal Adviser for East Asian Affairs, Department of State. Professor Li has authored numerous books and articles on U.S.-China relations and has testified before congressional committees on the legal implications of derecognition of Taiwan. Stephen Orlins has helped shape the Administration's policy with regard to the legal structure of ongoing commercial relations with Taiwan. Claims Settlement, Trade and Financing Arrangements with the Peoples Republic

Speakers for the third panel include Russell Munk, Assistant General Counsel, International Affairs, Department of the Treasury, who will speak on the U.S.-PRC claims settlement, and Cecil Hunt, Assistant General Counsel, Industry and Trade, Department of Commerce, who will speak on legal issues relevant to the adoption of a U.S.-China trade agreement. The speakers will also explore new financing arrangements with the PRC, including foreign lending and compensation trade. In addition to the above speakers, four panelists-most of whom have recently visited the Peoples Republic of China-will make comments and raise questions during each of the three panels. These panelists are: Professor Don Wallace, Jr. of Georgetown University Law Center who accompanied the President of the ABA on a visit to the PRC at the invitation of the Chinese government in July, 1978; E. Charles Routh, a Seattle attorney, who has practiced in the Far East and is currently Chairman of the Section of International Law's Far Eastern Law Committee; James R. Silkenat, a New York attorney who visited the PRC in November, 1978 with a 24-member delegation of lawyers from the Section of International Law, and is Chairman of that Section's Committee on Peoples Republic of China; and, Stephen W. Guittard, General Counsel and Secretary of Dow Corning Corporation, who also visited the PRC in November, 1978 as part of the International Law Section's delegation.

COMMENTARY

This program on Watergate reform is appropriately being held five years after the resignation of President Richard M. Nixon and three-and-one-half years after the ABA Special Committee on Federal Law Enforcement Agencies issued its report, "Preventing Improper Influence on Federal Law Enforcement Agencies." Yet many of the major problems stemming from Watergate and previous eras have not been fully resolved. The ABA report contained twenty recommendations for insulating federal law enforcement officials from the improper pressures seen in the Watergate affair, and these were approved by the House of Delegates in February, 1976. This program will explore how some of these recommendations for preventing future abuses have fared and what remains to be done. Key areas which will be discussed include the following:

FBI Charter

This is the hottest Watergate issue being considered by the Administration and Congress. One Presidential Executive Order has already been issued. The Department of Justice is considering additional federal regulations. Private organizations have issued model charters. Several bills in Congress are under active consideration. And the ABA has recommended that there be a specific legislative charter. Some key issues involve the question of whether in all cases it should be alleged that a crime has been or is about to be committed before an FBI investigation can commence; the nature of Departmental and Congressional oversight over the FBI; and the use of informants.

The Temporary Special Prosecutor

Based on ABA recommendations, Congress enacted—with the support of President Carter and the Department of Justice—the temporary special prosecutor legislation. It calls for the appointment of a temporary special prosecutor by a special division of the D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals when allegations of crime deemed substantial by the Attorney General are made against certain White House employees and other high ranking government officials. Allegations have been investigated and resolved under these provisions of the law including allegations against the President and his top aides. Mr. Spann will briefly recount the history of the ABA's recommendations and the legislation's ultimate passage. The Deputy Attorney General will comment on the operation of the Act.

Congressional Oversight Over U.S. Department of Justice

Until recently the Judiciary Committees of Congress were not involved in reviewing and authorizing funds for Justice Department programs on a formal basis. Judiciary Committee oversight thus lacked real clout stemming from the power of the purse. Legislation enacted several years ago—and renewed Congressional emphasis on oversight—has placed the judiciary committees directly in this process. The panel discussion will include comments on such oversight from both Congressional and Justice Department perspectives.

Appointment of U.S. Attorneys

Under the traditional method of choosing U.S. Attorneys, senior senators from a state

recommend individuals, or at least exercise a veto over particular appointments. The ABA has recommended the establishment of Federal District Commissions, composed of representatives of the Bar and the public, to recommend qualified appointees to the Department of Justice. The panel will take a close look at progress—or the lack thereof—in reducing partisan politics in the appointment of U.S. Attorneys.

The Office of Professional Responsibility

The ABA recommended the establishment of an office within the Department of Justice to investigate alleged internal abuses. Partially in response to the ABA recommendation, the Department of Justice established the Office of Professional Responsibility. This office has conducted investigations into some matters and has referred others to the branch of the Department directly involved in the allegations. Program participants will discuss the operations of this office, the resources available to it, its authority within the Department, and the prospects for legislation to make the office a permanent fixture.

COMMENTARY

This program focuses on the types of disputes now in the courts, their increasing shift from suits at law which resolve essentially private disputes to suits in equity which resolve disputes of a public character and which require continuing superintendence—in Professor Archibald Cox's words, "a shift from negative to affirmative adjudication." The panelists will attempt to identify this phenomenon and discuss the changes it has occasioned—changes both in methods of resolving disputes and in the traditional roles of judges, juries and advocates.

Introducing the panelists and framing the area of discussion will be Patrick E. Higginbotham, Judge of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas.

Professor Abram Chayes, Felix Frankfurter Professor at Harvard Law School, will examine shifts in judicial model's usage as a social dispute resolution mechanism and the implications of the public law expansion.

Analyzing judicial power and the new public law model will be Professor Haoui Berger. His critique will emphasize that the model is not constitutionally warranted. Professor Berger is the author of Government By The Judiciary: The Transformation of the Fourteenth Amendment (1977).

Justice Stanley Mosk of the California Supreme Court will discuss the rationale of the present judicial role, emphasizing its pluses and minuses.

Associate Justice John Paul Stevens of the United States Supreme Court will comment on the other presentations and relate the institutional stresses, strengths and weaknesses of the current judicial model.

Pros and cons of this timely issue! The major question today, the sponsors point out, is whether the all-volunteer armed service is working or is restoration of Selective Service, at least on a standby basis, called for? Also, who will handle the system? Congress is now grappling with these questions.

The Association has three Divisions, the Judicial Administration Division, the Law Student Division and the Young Lawyers Division.

The Judicial Administration Division

Divisions

The Judicial Administration Division consists of five judicial conferences: Appellate Judges, State Trial Judges, Special Court Judges, Administrative Law Judges and Federal Trial Judges—plus the Lawyers Conference and the Committee on the Traffic Court Program. In addition to 4,000 judge-members, there are about 3,000 members whose activities are conducted principally through the Lawyers Conference.

The Council, the governing body of the Division, coordinates the work of the conferences. Each conference has its own officers, by-laws and programs.


The Law Student Division has 30,000 members attending ABA-approved law schools across the nation and continues to grow. The Division is governed by a Board of Governors consisting of five national officers and thirteen circuit governors.

The Division sponsors the Client Counseling Competition, the National Appellate Advocacy Competition, the Law Student Counseling Program, a Liaison Program and the Law School Services Fund which provides grants to law schools for law-related projects. It publishes the Student Lawyer magazine and the Bi-Weekly Bulletin.

The Young Lawyers Division represents the 125,000 members of the Association under 36 years of age. The Executive Council, the Division's governing body, includes five officers and thirty district representatives. Delegates are selected by and represent the more than 200 state and local young lawyers bar associations affiliated with the Division.

The Division sponsors an annual Award of Achievement competition which provides national recognition for outstanding state and local young lawyer bar projects. Committees

Association Committees, consisting of Association members appointed by the President, are either Standing Committees or Special Committees depending upon the probable duration of the Committee's work. Standing Committees, normally consisting of seven members, are created within the Association's By-Laws to investigate and study issues of continuing or recurring importance to the purpose or business of the Association. The Association presently has 38 Standing Committees, examples of which include Continuing Education of the Bar, Ethics and Professional Responsibility, Federal Judiciary, Legal Aid and Indigent Defendants, Legislation, and Professional Discipline.

Special Committees investigate and study specific issues of immediate or non-recurring concern to the purpose or business of the Association. Special Committees, normally consisting of five members, are appointed on a year-to-year basis and address areas of activity such as Administration of Criminal Justice, Resolution of Minor Disputes, Delivery of Legal Services, Prepaid Legal Services, Public Interest Practice, and Youth Education for Citizenship. The Association currently has 34 Special Committees.

From time to time, Commissions are created. A Commission is a Special Committee whose membership includes non-lawyers, who are not members of the Association, whose participation is deemed necessary to resolve the problem assigned to the Commission. Examples of Commissions include the Commission on Advertising, on Correctional Facilities and Services, on the Mentally Dis-

abled, and on Medical Professional Liability.





Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the Association

The following proposed amendments to the Constitution of the Association will be considered by the Assembly at its session on Wednesday, August 15, and by the House of Delegates at its session on Tuesday, August 14. Notice of these proposed amendments was published in the June issue of the American Bar Association Journal.

SPONSORS: John P. Bracken, Stanley M. Brown, James D. Fellers, Osmer C. Fitts, Thomas B. Gay, James K. Groves, John D. Randall, Charles S. Rhyne, Barnabas F. Sears, Sylvester C. Smith, Jr., and Wm. B. Spann, Jr., all former Chairmen of the House of Delegates.

PROPOSAL: Amend the Constitution to provide for a one-year term on the Board of Governors for the Immediate Past Chairman of the House of Delegates.

Amend § 7.2 to read as follows:

§ 7.2 Composition. The Board of Governors is composed of members of the Association elected by the House, one from each district and three members-at-large, and the following ex officio members: the President, the Chairman of the House of Delegates, the President-Elect, the immediate past President, the immediate past Chairman of the House of Delegates for one Association year immediately following the expiration of his term, the Secretary, and the Treasurer.

SPONSORS: Earl B. Hadlow, Chairman, Section of Bar Activities; Chesterfield Smith, former President; Leroy Jeffers and Blake Tartt, members of the Texas delegation in the House of Delegates; and Michael Franck, former Delegate, Section of Bar Activities.

A

PROPOSAL: Amend the Constitution and the By-Laws* to change the time of election of members of the Board of Governors.

Effective at the conclusion of the 1981 Annual Meeting, amend § 7.3 to read as follows:

- § 7.3 Eligibility and Term. To be eligible for election to the Board of Governors other than as a member-at-large, a person must be accredited to the district for which he is elected, and he must be or have been a delegate in the House of Delegates. To be eligible for election as the young lawyer member-at-large, a person must be less than 34 years old at the beginning of his term. The judicial member-at-large must be an active member of the judiciary. The section member-at-large must be a person who was a section chairman at some time within three Association years immediately preceding the beginning of his term, a person who was a section delegate within the Association year immediately preceding the beginning of his term, or a person who is a section delegate at the beginning of his term. The term of an elected member of the Board is three Association years, beginning with the adjournment of the annual meeting next following his election.
- * A conforming amendment to the By-Laws will be considered by the House of Delegates.

PROPOSAL: Amend the Constitution to change the time of election of officers and to provide for successive ballots in contested elections.

Effective at the conclusion of the 1981 Annual Meeting, amend § 8.2 to read as follows:

- § 8.2 Election and Terms. (a) The President-Elect, the Secretary, and the Treasurer shall be elected by the House of Delegates at the midyear meeting immediately preceding their terms of office. The term of each is one Association year beginning with the adjournment of the annual meeting next following his election. The President-Elect becomes President of the Association at the end of his term as President-Elect and is not again eligible for either office.
- (b) The Chairman of the House of Delegates shall be elected by the House from among its members during the midyear meeting in even-numbered years. His term is two Association years, beginning with the adjournment of the annual meeting next following his election. During his term of office, he may not hold or seek any other office in the Association. He is not again eligible for the office of Chairman of the House, and during the two Association years following the expiration of his term he is ineligible for nomination to the office of President-Elect.
- (c) Election of officers shall be by majority vote of the delegates present and voting. Voting shall continue until a candidate receives a majority vote. On successive ballots, the name of the candidate receiving the fewest votes on the previous ballot shall be removed.

PROPOSAL: Amend the Constitution to change the time of nomination of officers and members of the Board of Governors, to require that the State Delegates nominate two or three persons for the office of President-Elect, and to change the period during which nominating petitions may be filed.

- 1. Effective at the conclusion of the 1981 Annual Meeting, except that the State Delegates are required to make nominations during or immediately preceding the 1981 Annual Meeting, amend § 9.2 to read as follows:
- § 9.2 By State Delegates. (a) At, or within seven days before, each annual meeting, the State Delegates shall convene and shall make and immediately

announce two or three nominations for the office of President-Elect, a nomination for each of the offices of Secretary and Treasurer, and a nomination for each member of the Board of Governors whose term expires upon the adjournment of the next annual meeting. At, or within seven days before, the annual meeting in each odd-numbered year, the State Delegates shall also make and immediately announce a nomination for the office of Chairman of the House of Delegates.

- (b) If a nominee dies, becomes disabled, or declines, the State Delegates shall convene at the midyear meeting and select another nominee for that office.
- (c) At least 20-days notice of the time and place of the meeting of the State Delegates, as determined by the Board of Governors, shall be given to each State Delegate. The Chairman of the House shall preside and the Secretary of the Association shall act as Secretary.
- (d) If the Board of Governors recommends, and the State Delegates by mail ballot determine, that because of extraordinary circumstances a nominating meeting should not be held, the nominations required shall be made by the State Delegates acting by mail vote conducted by the Board of Elections.
- 2. Effective at the conclusion of the 1981 Annual Meeting, except that nominating petitions for positions to be filled at the 1982 Midyear Meeting may be filed not earlier than 90 days before the 1981 Annual Meeting, amend § 9.3(a) to read as follows:
- \S 9.3 By Petition. (a) Not earlier than 90 days before nor later than 90 days after the annual meeting, other nominations for the Board of Governors or for any office to be filled by election at the next midyear meeting may be made by filing with the Secretary a petition and the written consent of the nominee.

PROPOSAL: Amend the Constitution to require that Midyear Meetings of the Association and of the House of Delegates be held.

- 1. Effective at the conclusion of the 1981 Annual Meeting, amend § 4.1 to read as follows:
- § 4.1 Annual and Midyear Meetings. The annual meeting and the midyear meeting of the Association shall each be held once during each calendar year at a time and place determined by the Board of Governors. Each such meeting may include meetings of the Board of Governors, sections, and committees as the Board may authorize. The annual meeting shall also include meetings of the Assembly. Notice of each meeting shall be given to members of the Association at least six months in advance.
- 2. Effective at the conclusion of the 1981 Annual Meeting, amend § 4.2 to read as follows:
- § 4.2 Other Meetings. In addition to the annual meeting and the midyear meeting, the Association shall hold such other meetings, including special and regional meetings, as the Board of Governors may prescribe.
- 3. Effective at the conclusion of the 1981 Annual Meeting, amend \S 6.10 to read as follows:
- § 6.10 Meetings of the House. The House of Delegates shall meet during the annual meeting and the midyear meeting of the Association and at such other times and at such places as the Board of Governors may prescribe. Special meetings of the House shall be called by the President at the written request of a majority of the delegates. Forty-days notice of a meeting of the House shall be given to each delegate and to each section or committee chairman. However, if because of unusual urgency two-thirds of the members of the Board authorize a special meeting of the House held solely for a limited purpose specified in the notice, 15 days is sufficient. Each delegate has only one vote, which must be cast in person. A quorum is 100 delegates.

NOTE: Additional conforming amendments to the By-Laws will be considered by the House of Delegates.


