Miss Eldridge in Congressman Frank Thompson's office (D., N. J.) called to ask that a set of application forms be sent the Congressman's office for a constituent of the Congressman who is interested in a position with the Agency. This was done.

[redacted] Personnel Office, called to say that [redacted] who was referred to the Agency by Senator McClellan and Representative Halleck was being invited to come to Washington from [redacted] at Government expense to be interviewed regarding the JOT program. There was no recruiter available in his vicinity. This Office will be notified of the results of the interview.

Captain Mott and Colonel Grace, representing General Twining, came over and reviewed the transcript of the CIA testimony before the Johnson Subcommittee. They indicated that they were preparing General Twining's statement for his appearance and that their primary concern was that certain figures which they were going to include in their statement should conform to the figures used by the DCI.

Mr. Bryce Harlow of the White House (Governor Adams' office) met with the Director and went over most of the transcript of the Johnson Subcommittee hearings where CIA testified. He was looking for items that might be seized on as political issues. He has not completed his review and will call again.

The Director requested that there be prepared a full statement of his previous appearances before Congressional committees on the missile question. He also requested that there be pulled together whatever reports or material we had on missiles particularly with reference to [redacted]

[redacted] These matters were discussed with Mr. Amery who stated that Mr. Steerts had started on the statement of Congressional appearances and could carry on with this. On the earlier material on missiles, Mr. Amery stated he would request Colonel John White to begin work on this. Later I talked to Steerts and he will prepare the Congressional item.
