4. The two external Introductory French tutorial programs which are being supervised by the LAS French staff, began 1 October and are scheduled to complete 200 hours of instruction on or about 18 December. Meetings average three hours daily. It is expected that upon completion of this program the students will have acquired an introductory knowledge of spoken and written French sufficient to enable them to get along in the commonest situations of daily life and travel.

LAS has provided texts with accompanying tapes, dual-track tape recorders and continuing consultation and guidance for the tutors. Arrangements are being made to give the students oral and written examination to evaluate achievement during and at the end of the course.
