DDS	5. We have met with our first case of refusal to accept a proposed external training activity. The reason is understandable and may also be encountered from others in the future. It is a strong objection to attending FT language courses at NSA (Fort Meade), which means a daily drive of extreme length, especially for Virginia residents. This may deprive us of NSA's courses in many cases when they would otherwise be
