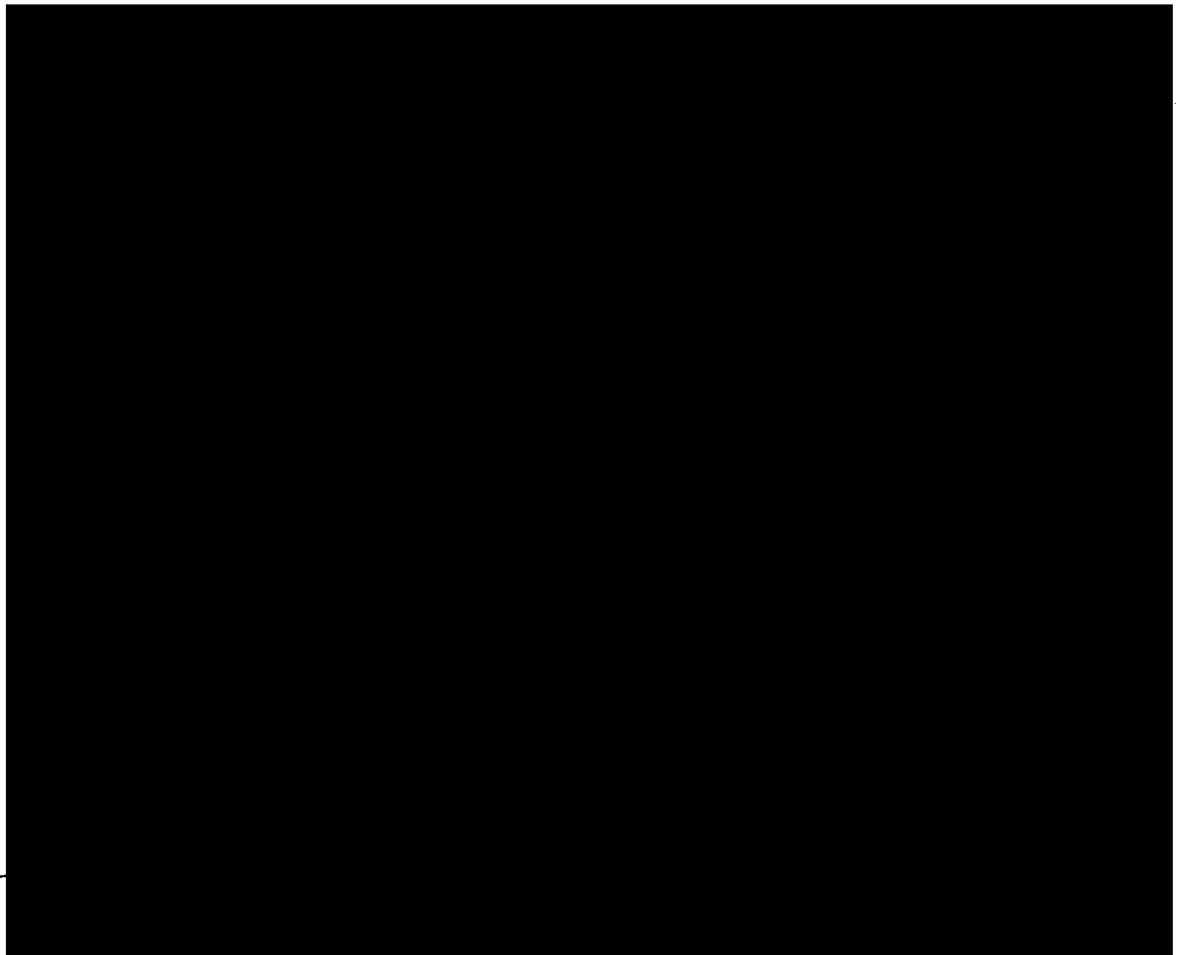
PROBLEM:

3. Full coordination was effected with [REDACTED] Chairman, IDC; and [REDACTED] Chief, 25X1A EE Division/DDP, prior to the departure [REDACTED] of GMIC staff 25X1A representatives. Also, informal coordination was effected with Mr. [REDACTED] Chief, [REDACTED] who was on TDY in Washington, D. C.

4. [REDACTED] is extremely receptive to the offer of GMIC guidance and support and indicated great interest in GMIC's preliminary planning in this area. An ad hoc subcommittee of GMIC was established on 21 May 1956 to review all existing guided missile intelligence guides and requirements that might be used in the interrogation [REDACTED] Where it appears that such guides are inadequate or outdated, GMIC will take appropriate action to provide adequate, up-to-date guidance for the use of [REDACTED] 25X1C

5. Channels of communication and administrative procedures were established to insure a rapid flow of information and guidance between [REDACTED] and GMIC.

6. [REDACTED] indicated a possible requirement for support on the scene by a representative of GMIC assigned to the [REDACTED] staff. GMIC indicated a capability to provide such support if and when requested 25X1C officially [REDACTED] 25X1C

7. Within the broad framework of these discussions with [REDACTED] further detailed planning will be initiated.

8. In coordination with [REDACTED] GMIC agreed to provide a list of basic questions in the field of guided missile intelligence to be used in the preliminary interrogation [REDACTED] Further discussion with [REDACTED] pointed up the critical need for intelligence relative to the Soviet guided missile program and indicated the increased probability of guided missile knowledgeability by future [REDACTED] sources as the Soviet guided missile program progresses from Research and Development (R&D) to operational deployment.

25X1C 10. In January 1956, a [REDACTED] Guided Missile Intelligence
25X1C Conference was tentatively scheduled to be held in Washington, D. C.,
25X1C in the Fall of 1956. [REDACTED] now indicate they would prefer to

by GMIC.
