The AD/RR's meeting with O/RR Industrial Panel Consultants terminated Saturday evening, 2 June. The agenda included round-table discussions of key Soviet economic problems prepared for the Industrial Consultants by O/RR analysts, on such subjects as Soviet iron, steel, electric power, chemical capabilities, [redacted] economic consultant to G-2, participated. The group discussed National Estimates with members of the Board. They gave considerable assistance and promised more on a program to recruit technical experts for O/RR.
